- Safety Rep: Jessica to take over at AGM Possibly parents put pressure on the DPAC for funding. Joanna to grab and fill the items for Earthquake kit.

- Paying for 2 skating dates \$700

- Hot lunch is doing well for funds. A lot of e-transfers.
