## Grade 6/7's at Arden:

- Mr. Ferneyhough has inquired about grade 6/7 students returning to Arden and for now the feedback that was received is that:

- 3. Classrooms and/or spaces that can appear available have been filled with other support services for the school that in previous years were not there.

# Trustee Report: Sara Jane Howe

# Strategic Plan

Superintendent Morrow talked about our upcoming work with Lisa Bernoties McCullough and how we will be engaging with her in January on our new strategic plan and its process. So, we will likely amend our working plan and strategic plan after we engage with Lisa in January. He spoke about our Trustee Academy a speaker that we heard there (Kevin Lamoureux, University of Winnipeg) and how it is our sacred responsibility to love and care for our children.

He clarified 5 ways our system can experience love in meaningful way:

- -The students we serve see themselves in our system
- -Take the time to honor culture
- -They get the message that every single child is capable of succeeding.
- -Every student gets the message that they are strong and capable

-As a system we recognize that every child has gifts and we create the space for them to share that

He spoke about honoring these thoughts as we move into building our strategic plan. These concepts

are alive and well in SD71 but until every child gets this experience.We need to be relentless that every child feels this: every child, every chance, every day and it is our intention that our new plan captures the spirit of this.

## Policy work:

- The Board ad hoc policy committee has met and are working on few specific policies and making a review plan.
- The committee discussed the practicability of completing the annual requirements as currently stipulated. Further review will occur to align policy annual requirements with our Board Work Plan.
- Policy #1 Foundational Statements & amp; Policy #24 Equity and Non-Discrimination have been identified and are being worked on now.
- Trustees that are working on it are Trustee Aldinger & amp; Trustee Mc Cannel-Keene

### New Senior Staff:

- We are currently in the process of Hiring new ST. Things are moving along More to come in the January meeting.
- Superintendent Morrow shared information regarding the hiring of a new Assistant Superintendent of Indigenous Education

### Accessibility Committee:

- We had an update from the district a committee has been established and there is a working group that formed to ensure that we meet the requirements of the accessible BC Act to better serve the needs of students.
- There is a place to provide feedback on our website under "Our District" then "Accessibility in our schools"
- There should have been an email sent out from CCS with an opportunity to provide feedback as well.

## Early Years Update:

• Lisa Pederson Skeene talked about childcare spaces in general in our district and provided some data in our package around the numbers and the stress that strong start is facing due to limited ministry funding. She is doing great work with all families to try to ensure smooth transitions to school and shared some info of a few early years conferences coming up to work together in the Comox Valley to continue to support early years and some of the programming that has been happening.

## DPAC report: JJ Goff

#### Rent Bank:

- Works with all renters from across the Valley who have fallen on financial hardship/short term crisis.
- Provides low barrier loans with a low interest and a repayment period between 24-36 months. Repayment is based off what is affordable to the applicant ie: \$5
- Requirements of the program are that the cost is no more that \$3,000 per month, that the applicant is no more than 2 months in arrears and that they are capable of paying the loan back.
- Time is spent with the applicants to understand their circumstances
- awareness of community supports in the valley

- The program offers a low stigma and does not impact in a negative way for the applicant.
- Goal of the Rent Bank is to provide housing stability and prevent homelessness.
- Program has been in the valley for 13 months and has provided \$35,000 in support.

### **AGM:** January 8, 2024

#### **BC Summit:**

- The ministry does not cover the cost of a portable. The cost comes directly out of a school's funding.
- Every dollar that is spent on a portable is no longer going into a classroom

### **Emergency Preparedness:**

- 4 year replacement plan with \$25,000 provided each year to replace the food for C-Can
- A main focus is to have consistency throughout all Comox Valley Schools.
- Financial responsibility to fall on the school district.

#### **Suicide Prevention:**

• 988 suicide prevention hotline, free of charge across Canada

#### Accessibility Committee:

• Feedback was provided about the accessibility committee. Discussion about the lack of parents on the committee, no real understanding on who is involved. Looking for more transparency across the board.

## Salad Bar Report: Lesia Wick

- Approx 200-210 students served each week (about 25 absent and only a handful who take nothing). Teachers and support staff are being well fed. Averaging around 235 servings each week at the school.
- We received the Comox Valley Community Foundations grant (\$3000) to purchase a Speedibin composter to support salad bar through 'garden to plate and back to garden' connections with salad bar as well as additional cupboards for the multipurpose room for food program storage.
- Division 7 (Mrs Smith's grade 3's) won November "Least waste" challenge for compost. The school as a whole has reduced their weekly salad bar compost from 2.5 buckets down to 1 bucket!
- Jennifer Steel has had a compost bucket donated to each classroom
- JJ, Wade and Lesia all participated and completed the foodsafe program over the weekend.

• \$3500 available to purchase a new swing set. Still working on finding the most suitable swing set that will allow for 6 new swings. Update will be provided as the process moves along.
