Presenters and Reports

SD71-

Director of Operations- Ian Heselgrave

- Discussed his role and responsibilities within SD 71
- Addressed that space within SD71 continues to be in a state of crisis as enrollment continues to rise.
- Child Care facility at Arden:
 - -Purpose is to provide a seamless transition for children from the early years (daycare/preschool) into the school setting. Arden previously had Wee Care to provide before and after school care, however, a lack of space with growing numbers did not allow for the program to continue at the school.
 - -Parents voiced their concerns about the additional vehicle traffic that the childcare facility would add. Concerns for student safety getting to and from school.
- Feeding futures: continue to work on kitchen enhancements.
- Swings:
 - -lan provided an update and clarity on the process of schools acquiring new playground equipment
 - -Staff time is the biggest barrier in having such projects completed as they have other roles and responsibilities such as snow removal, lawn maintenance ect.
 - -Possibility of 1 to 2 new playgrounds or swings to be added to a school per season.
 - -School funds are utilized to complete these projects.
 - -Engaging conversation about leaving the rocks where they are currently located and exploring other locations for the swings. The rocks remain very popular among the students and provide healthy play that is being encouraged.
 - Suggestions to be considered: Poured in place rubber surface vs woodchips
 - Poured rubber surface would allow the option of an accessibility swing similar to the one at Hornby Island School, which was possible through a Variety Grant.

Path forward:

- Ian Heselgrave and Mr. Ferneyhough to look around and find a better location for the swings next week. Placement is important and supervision needs to be factored in as well.
- 3 separate quotes will be necessary
- PAC will apply for any additional grants that may be required ie: BC tire Stewarship
- Possibility that the new equipment could be installed in May/June or September-November.

DPAC Report: JJ Goff

 Gina Taylor the physical literacy teacher for SD71 provided a presentation about the importance of physical literacy and that it is as important as reading and writing for students. Gina works on the fundamental movement skills that students require to build up in order to keep active. Examples of fundamental movement skills include running, hopping, skipping, jumping, balancing, dribbling and catching.

• White Hatter Series:

- started February 6th with 2 more online presentations (Feb 15/20). The first presentation is geared towards students in grade 6-8 and appropriate for both parents and students to watch. The following 2 are meant for parents.
- -If you cannot watch it live the link is available for 48 hours after
- -Permission was given by DPAC to have the link shared through the schools email. However, this is only for Arden families and DPAC asks that the link is not forwarded to others.
- Update from the Superintendent:
 - -New cell phone policy is in the works
 - continuing to work on effective and open communication remains a priority
 - -The draft for feeding futures has been completed and a vote will take place at the end of Febuary.

• School Messenger App:

- Arden currently does not use the app. At this time, the current system in place is felt to be manageable with the schools numbers and is considered a good touch point for many of the families attending Arden.
- -Decision to implement or not implement the app is at the administration level

- -Parents who support the implementation of the app feel that it streamlines the communication process between children at multiple schools. It was also highlighted that the app allows for notifications to be sent to their cellphone such as snow days and hold and secures
- Tribune Bay Centre is closed indefinitely. Any schools that have booked trips will need to ensure that they receive their refunds. The closure is due to lack of funding.
- It was brought forward that some parents are looking towards establishing an anti racism committee within the district. They are looking for individuals who have experienced racism personally. For anyone who has had personal experience please email DPAC directly dpac@sd71.bc.ca
- 2 schools shared that they did a West Coast Seeds fundraiser and raised a total of \$3000
