Hello everyone,

Thanks for the great week back. It was a bit tricky getting used to the new sleep routines, me included, but I'd say we did pretty well:)

One thing that came up at our last staff meeting was the importance of making parents aware that Arden has several different types of ways of reporting about student achievement. This can be confusing for families with multiple children. First, there are those that are doing MyEd reporting which comes in the form of 'Report Cards' as were handed out before the break. Then, there are ePortfolios which come out on a regular basis in the online portfolios. Finally, many of our teachers have Paper Portfolios which they can either send home at certain times of the year or invite you in to look at them together. Please contact your teacher if you would like to know more about their particular reporting process. I hope this helps to clarify...a bit:)

The first week of our universal lunch program was a huge success! We are serving an average of 120 meals per day!! Based on parent feedback I want to clarify the following :

- This program is <u>pay what you can</u>. Regardless of the wording on Munch a Lunch, there is no expectation for families to contribute more than what they can. We will continue to work with Munch a Lunch to update the wording to reflect our intent but in the meantime please don't let the wording deter you from accessing the lunch program.
- This week we have been able to test the anonymity function of Munch a Lunch in real time. We can now confirm that there is no connection between payment amounts and student orders. All students who have ordered receive the same food as their classmates with no differentiation between payment methods.
- Families who have ordered but not paid, receive an order confirmation that looks like a bill. This is purely an order confirmation and no action needs to be taken. We are working on having the wording changed to reflect this, thank you for your patience.
- Salad bar is operated by LTCES and will continue to be offered to all students on Wednesdays, regardless of whether it was ordered, paid for or not. We will be changing the option for financial contributions to salad bar for the February menu. Thank you for your feedback and patience while we worked out a plan to continue with a free salad bar that could be supported by parent contributions.
- This is a pilot program and your feedback is appreciated we want this to be accessible and sustainable! Nicole is available Monday-Friday to chat about everything school food, please get in touch with her 🙂

Late French Immersion Registration for 2025–2026 School Year

The Late French Immersion program accepts students who have completed Grade 5 in an English program at a neighbourhood school.

As they enter Grades 6 and 7 at École Puntledge Park, they study French, in an Immersion setting. For Grade 8, they join Early French Immersion students transitioning to Mark R. Isfeld Secondary.

In addition to the provincial "Dogwood" certificate, successful graduates of the Late French Immersion program receive a Bilingual Graduation Certificate at the end of Grade 12.
