This goal of "\$1 per Canadian" remains a central part of the [Terry Fox Foundation](#)'s legacy, though the foundation has since raised over \$850 million in total for cancer research through subsequent Terry Fox Runs and other initiatives. Every day, students from Ms. Cameron and Mr. Holt's class visit each Division to collect donations for the Terry Fox Foundation. If your child is able to bring in \$1.00, \$2.00 or more to school to donate towards this cause for cancer research, it would be greatly appreciated! 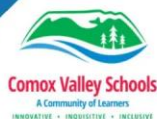
Program Highlights
