- DPAC Report: Erika Davis

- Presentation on early literacy (K–3) at last week's meeting.
- Pre-COVID volunteer literacy reading programs are no longer in place.
- Concerns noted about reduced small-group reading time during regular class schedules.
- Strong belief that all students benefit from literacy support, especially in catching early struggles before formal learning disability assessments are possible. Early intervention = better outcomes.
- Questions raised:
 - When does Inclusive Ed become involved?
 - What is the current state of literacy support across the district (variability school to school)?
- Senior leadership will:
 - Gather information and report on current literacy support practices district-wide.
 - Make recommendations to a working group (teachers + district staff) to rebuild a standardized literacy support system across the district.
- More updates to come as the district progresses with this work.
- Other DPAC Discussion
 - Ongoing review of PAC in-service funding:
 - Funds provided by the district to each school PAC.
 - Goal is fairness across the district and clarity on eligible vs. ineligible spending.

Open Floor for questions and discussion

- JJ G. has brought up that she is concerned that teachers are close to being burnt out and needing support.
 - She is concerned that with both her boys having designations that went from 100% support last year to 0% support this year.
 - JJ is asking that parents use their voice and speak up about the lack of support that other parents are feeling because she believes that the 'iron is hot' with the district at the moment.
 - What JJ would like: We need boots on the ground. Bodies on the ground that help support our children at the moment they need it. Bumping behavioral support to 3 days a week to close the gap with our counsellor only being here 4 days a week, and 2 more EA's to support Arden. Request an additional support person to help children receive access to outside Arden/district wide resources that are available including the swimming program.
 - **ACTION:** JJ is going to write a letterhead that she is requesting that additional parents help put their voice down on paper so she can send everything to Tracy at the district to make change happen. She wants the support by Friday so she can send her letter. She is asking for the bullet points of change that we as a school want to see changed.

Bullet Points Proposed by JJ:

- 2 Extra EA's
- 1 Extra EA to access district wide resources that are available outside of Arden.
- 3 Days a week from the behavioural support person to close the gap
- Mr.Ferneyhough please request that parents come to him before going straight to the district. Give him an opportunity to be looped in before going to the district.
