Mason Bee- from the use of mud in their next chamber

Blue Orchard Bee- In the sun they reflect an iridescent blue

Fun Facts

Mason Bees are solitary but gregarious- They live in colonies but work separately. Each female finds a nest and provisions the next and produces young by herself with out help from other bees.

There are 3996 species of solitary bees. 16 species live on Vancouver Island.

For each new bee- she must gather pollen to feed the larva. To do this she will need to visit 75 flowers for 1 load, it will take 25 laods to feed each larva. When added up that is 1875 flowers for each new bee. She had the ability to lay up to 30 eggs in her life time of 8 weeks. That is up to 56,250 flowers.
