

Sandwich Trades Education Program: STEP Application

STEP Program



Sandwich Technical Education Project is an initiative that is structured to continue the exploration and preparation of job-related skills to students, so they can be prepared for part time work during their schooling years, and for work after graduation within the trades. Currently, we are offering skills related to electrical, plumbing, welding, cooking, carpentry, and masonry along with certifications to support entrance into the workforce.

Students can sign up through their Work Experience office for the six-day exploration. The students will work out of Sandwich School once a week for six weeks on a set day, ex. Tuesdays for six weeks.

The STEP program will continue to provide students with certifications and/or training for:

- Ladder safety
- WHIMIS
- Supervisor Management
- Scaffolding
- Fall Arrest
- Lockout

The student workday is from 9:00am to 2:45pm.

RISKS: Students will be working with electricity, working with hand and power tools, concrete and will be exposed to chemicals. Protective gear is provided.

30 HRS: If you need your 30hrs for graduation you will have the opportunity on day 4 to get this set up. At the completion of the program, you will receive your sign off for your 30hrs.

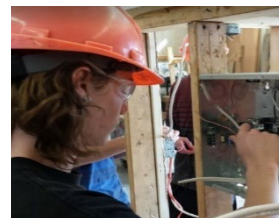
