FILLONGLEY BEACH DAY - JUNE 19TH @ 10:30-2:00 PM

We are excited to celebrate National Indigenous Peoples Day at Fillongley Provincial Park on Thursday, June 19th.

This 23-hectare park has special significance – as is evidenced by the middens. Archaeological digs (since 1956) have noted 33 sites on Denman Island (as a whole) and identified at least five likely village locations that are approximately 2500-3000 years old. At Fillongley, archaeologists unearthed the remains of dwellings such as house pillars and oblong depressions and other evidence to be the remnants of plank houses.

Here's our plan on Thursday, June 19th

10:30-11:00 am Take school bus and 4-6 private vehicles to Fillongley.

Review expectations, boundaries, and plan with students.

11:00 – noon-ish 5 Stations in the field in multi-age groups, led by Amei, Claire,

Daniel Farrow, Emily, Tonya Lowe, and Vanessa

Noon-ish – 2:00 pm Lunch and Free time.

Special guests, Maxine, Ron, Gracie, Al, and possibly Nicolas will

assist with smoking salmon and making bannock.


2:00 pm Take school bus & private vehicles back to school.

DICES is excited to share our upcoming summer season of programming. Please read through this entire document to familiarize yourself with our registration process and other important information for a safe and happy camp experience.

day camp

- When: July 7 August 21, 2025 Monday Thursday, 10 am to 2 pm (except August 5 to 8th, Tuesday to Friday because of the long weekend)
- Fee: \$150 week
- Age Range: children aged 9 to 13 years old except digital music making, and soccer which are
 open for up to 15 year olds.

Each camp is facilitated by community friends with cool talents, trained DICES staff and our dedicated volunteers.

Week 1: July 7 - 10 Passport to Denman and Hornby

Field trips to the special places on our islands! Every day is a new destination. Come prepared to do some walking! Gaelle and Gracie will lead this one. More details about destinations once you are registered!

Week 2: July 14 - 17 NEW!! Weaving Wonders Learn to create your own fabric patterns with the guidance of Denman's talented Weaver's group members. At the end of the week you will take home a unique piece of fabric art! This will also prepare you to make even more complicated designs after school next fall. All materials are supplied.

Week 3: July 21 - 24 Found Objects Composition Do you like exploring sounds and creating music?! Are you interested in learning about music composition?! Join Beau (drummer and longtime educator) in creating music compositions with found objects in an orchestra! We'll start with finding objects in our environment and then explore how to create musical sounds with them. Then, we'll collaboratively organize them into compositions in an orchestra. While we do this, we'll learn about music composition, improvisation, rhythm, and melody.

Week 4: July 28 - 31 Digital Music Making (Ages 9 - 15) Do you like creating music with computers?! Join Beau (drummer and longtime educator) in creating electronic music in a band! We'll start with digitally processing our own recorded sounds then use our basic musicianship abilities on musical instruments to collaboratively compose melodies, lyrics, progressions and grooves. While we do this, we'll form up bands with our old and new friends and then put on a killer show!

Week 5: August 5 - 8 (Tuesday to Friday) NEW! Dance with Georgia Try out a variety of dance styles with the talented Georgia Allen! Georgia is an experienced dancer who looks forward to having fun with movement and music and you!

Week 6: August 11 - 14 NEW! Soccer camp (ages 9 to 15) whether you are a complete beginner or a league player, Kevin and Enrico will coach you to have fun and learn some skills! Depending on interest, campers may play other team sports as well.

Week 7: August 18 - 21 NEW! Garden to table Chef camp with Kimberley Create delicious recipes using ingredients from right here on Denman! Kimberley is an experienced chef and farmer, and we will use the bounty from the school garden and beyond to inspire in the kitchen!

Registration

Registration opens on June 6 and closes at the end of day on June 23. On or before June 27, DICES will send you an email outlining the camps your child/ren is/are registered for with an attached invoice and, if requested, a bursary application form. Camp spots are confirmed once DICES receives a full payment for camp fees (e-transfer, cheque, cash) and we will confirm your child's registration with another email once payment is received.

A registration form is required for EACH CAMPER. If you are registering more than one child, please submit a registration form for each child. This is to ensure that we have all the information we need for each individual camper.

What if our schedule changes?

If you are unable to attend camp and provide 2 weeks notice we are able to provide a full refund! With less than 2 weeks notice, we are unable to provide a refund for fees paid.

What if we get sick?

If the camper becomes ill and cannot attend, we are able to refund for the week(s) missed with a medical note.

What if my camper is only available for part of the week?

Camp registration is for a full week of camp, not individual days.
