The Bike Storage Shed was supposed to begin construction last month, so we are eagerly awaiting phase one to begin, and another project taking shape is the beautification of the two inner courtyards. Staff and students have been involved in moving dirt, setting up containers, trimming branches, and making the spaces relaxing spots for students and staff to spend time.
