4. Unfinished Business

a) Diversion of PAC funds due to Covid 19

After a in-depth discussion on various needs of the school, including reviewing a list of needs/wants of teacher/admin requests, it was decided that we would allocate the unused gaming and unallocated funds from the 2019/2020 budget, in the amount of \$10,285.24 towards the purchase of three concrete picnic tables to be added to the two currently located at the front of the school building. This will add more seats for outside lunch as well as create a space that could be used for outside learning. Each concrete picnic table will cost \$1200.00 approx. The remainder of the funds will be used for phase one in building a Bike Storage to be located adjacent to the student parking lot. Stage one includes pouring a concrete slab and building a bike lock rack.

6. Principals Report – Julie Shields

Term 1 is well underway, and the first set of electives has transferred over. Vanier is following COVID protocols – limiting visitors, masks in hallways and all common areas, separating learning groups and classrooms, etc. Reducing interactions has caused reduction in services to students – access to teachers for extra help being one of them. Shortened lunch time, reduced entry into the

building, no late buses on Monday and Thursday all have meant less help for students, which is the reason we are adopting a Flex Day into our schedule. This day will occur 6 times a term. If students are caught up in their classes, they will have a choice to come in and work with staff. If they are behind, students can be required to come in and get extra help and caught up. Both Highland and Isfeld have some form of flex in their weekly schedule, and this time will help Vanier students with the structure and pace of their courses.

Some athletics are returning to our building, but in a very limited way. The COVID restrictions have meant that most of the time is spent on practices and drills rather than competition and games – which must be done within a learning group. Some clubs have started up, again following social distancing requirements.

As we move into November, we are re-evaluating all the changes in our building. New classes mean new learning groups. Severe weather means moving inside the building at lunch and before school (on a limited basis). We are always reminding students and staff to follow the protocols – sanitize their hands, wear masks, reduce physical interactions, plan for virtual presentations, etc.

The term will end before we know it, and we will be into quarter 2. The Parent Teacher Interview Day will continue to be a non-instructional day, however teaching staff are asked to connect with all parents of students who are struggling each term, and staff have been given a list of the weeks this must be done. Any parents with concerns are encouraged to connect with their child's teacher at any time. Our contact information can be found on our website.
