

We would like to take this time to welcome all our students, both new and returning, to the new school year, as well as let parents and students know what next week and the new school year will look like for them. Tuesday, September 6th will be a shortened day specifically for new students to Vanier only, regardless of grade. As we have more than 450 students new to Vanier, this will allow them to tour the building with their homeroom teachers, find their classes, and meet our staff and their teachers on a day that is a little quieter than normal.



Buses will pick up students at their regular morning times and start leaving Vanier at 12:45. Students should have registered for a bus pass and received their route information already. Registration for a bus pass can be found [HERE](#). After Friday, Sept 16th, students will require their bus pass to ride the bus or have a temporary pass from the school office. **Please take a picture of your bus pass, as this will be sufficient to show your bus driver.** Students will receive bus passes in the first week of school during their homeroom class.

HOMEROOM

Home rooms for each student and a map of the school will be posted in a number of locations around our school. When students get to their homeroom, they will receive their timetable, a map of the school and demographics (to be verified by parents, signed and returned). To be prepared for the day, students should have a pen, paper, and binder – anything else, the teachers will let them know about.

SOME INFORMATION YOU MAY FIND USEFUL

Vanier's school day will be 9:05 – 3:15, every day. Lunch will be from 11:50 – 12:35. Students will have four classes a day. Vanier will be incorporating Flex Days into our calendar, which will occur on some Wednesdays – although not as frequently as last year. More information will follow on the calendar.

The Student Fees for 2022-2023 are payable on the first day of school (or later) and are \$25, and cover locker rental, student leadership events, activities, and presentations throughout the year. With COVID and the need to reduce handling of money, the preferred ways to pay for students are to come to the office where we have a debit machine, a cheque (made payable to Georges P. Vanier School) or paying online through MyEducationBC. The attachment to this email outlines the process to pay online. Many parents also prefer to pay for a yearbook at this time, which is \$55 this year – with a special discount for September set at \$50.

A lock and locker will be issued through homeroom. Students **will not need** to purchase a lock unless they wish to have one to use in the PE changerooms, which is recommended.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES




School supply lists are not available from the office, as any extra supplies beyond the basics will be communicated by each subject teacher. Basic supplies such as pens, pencils, paper and a binder will get students through the first few days of school. Many classes are moving to blended learning, utilizing technology inside the classroom. A Bluetooth keyboard paired with an electronic device would be beneficial for them, and students are allowed to bring lap tops to school if they wish to use their own.

MyEducationBC



The Parent Portal and Student Portal of MyEducationBC will be reactivated soon, so that this year's schedules can be viewed. The student portal and parent portals are identical, except a parent account can be linked to several student accounts, allowing you to log in once

for all your children. MyEd is a great tool for knowing if your son or daughter is falling behind or has work yet to be handed in to the teacher. Report cards are sent home electronically through MyEd. Students can check their transcripts, and parents can check which class a student was marked absent. We can send you some resources that will help navigate the program if you wish to receive them. COURSE CHANGES

G.P. Vanier Course Change Request Guidelines

Due to the complexity and volume of course change requests, **we will not be able to process change requests via email or over the phone.** Thanks for your understanding.

Course changes will take place over the first few days of school. Students needing course changes should listen to the announcements and come to the counselling office when their grade is called.

Schedule for Course Change Requests (Approximate)

September 6 Tuesday – **New Students**

September 7 Wednesday – **Grade 12's**

September 8 Thursday – **Grade 11's**

September 9 Friday – **Grade 10's**

September 12 Monday – **Grade 9's**

September 13 Tuesday – Last day for semester 1. **Any remaining (All Grades 9 – 12)**

International Students – wanting a course change must see Ms. Baron in room 118 during B or C block.

Students MUST attend all classes, even the classes they hope to change until the change has been made. If students do not have a class in a block, they should report to the library.



Schedule changes are extremely limited. We will try to accommodate course change requests for the following reasons:

- * I am missing a graduation requirement
- * I have a serious unbalanced academic load
- * I need to reschedule a failed course
- * I am missing a course that is needed for post-secondary
- * I have a semester 1 “See Counsellor” block

Course changes will NOT be granted for the following reasons:

- * I want a different teacher
- * I want to be with friends

Study blocks are granted for Grade 12's only. Grade 12's can request ONE Study Block for Semester 1. Study blocks for Semester 2 will not be granted at this time but can be applied for. Students can pick up a Study Block request form at the counselling office or print off the form from the G.P. Vanier website under Quick Links.

Teaching Assistant and Independent Directed Study (IDS) forms will be available on the table outside the counselling office.

COVID SPECIFIC INFORMATION

We will continue to follow all recommended COVID protocols from the Ministry of Health, Ministry of Education, and Local Health Authority. As such, this information may change if a new protocol or recommendation is made.

NEW CELL PHONE POLICY

Electronic devices can be distracting to student learning. There is a significant body of research showing that increased technology use is linked to problems with mental health, focus, and the development of relationships and academic skills. Therefore, this year we will ensure that electronic devices are turned off and out of sight during class time unless students have been given permission to use them for educational, health or safety purposes. Students may use them during non-class time (before school, recess, lunch, after school, etc.) unless directed otherwise by a staff member.
