Parksville Quilthouse Quilters' Guild Scholarship Selection Criteria

The applicant must

1. be a graduate from school District 68, 69, 70, or 71

or

be a member, a child or grandchild of a member in good standing with the Guild

- 2. be pursuing a degree in textile arts or fashion design. Degrees in Fine Arts and Graphic Design will be considered if the candidate demonstrates that these will be related to fibre / textile arts or fashion design.
- 3. have successfully completed a course of study in textiles or fashion design at secondary school

or

be able to demonstrate (with photos, samples, testimonials, or awards) a strong personal interest in quilting, quilting history or textile arts, including fashion design.

4. currently at, or entering, a Canadian post-secondary institution.

In addition to meeting the criteria, the candidate must provide a

- 1. transcript of grades for grade 11 and 12 courses
- 2. letter of recommendation from a teacher
- 3. letter from the applicant indicating
 - why he / she deserves the scholarship
 - plans for education and subsequent career
 - plans for affiliation with the Guild, if any.
