* **Cmolik Foundation Scholarships**

While a post-secondary education can be life-changing, it's a goal that's out of reach for many students. We're trying to change that. Every year, we award up to 20 scholarships, each one a maximum of \$40,000 paid over five years of study, to students graduating from BC high schools. Scholarship recipients have faced adversity but have responded with positivity and tenacity, achieving academic and social goals. With hard work and support, their post-secondary dreams can become a reality.

What's more, students who are awarded the Undergraduate Scholarship are eligible to apply for our Graduate Scholarships, one \$30,000 and two \$15,000 scholarships.

* **VERNA J. KIRKNESS EDUCATION FOUNDATION**

The Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation Program addresses the under-representation of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students at Canadian universities. One of the factors contributing to this is the lack of academic role models for Indigenous students.

Our Foundation addresses this by offering scholarships to Indigenous students in grades 11 and 12 to spend a week at a Canadian university, interacting with scientists in their research laboratories. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic our week-long program is offered and will return to in-person lab research when it is safe to do so. During the week instruction on campus (or virtually) the students have the opportunity to meet role models, learn about the support systems that are available to them on campus and experience the excitement of doing research.
