- \* **Horatio Alger Canadian Scholarships**

The Canadian Scholarships are awarded to eligible students across all provinces and territories in Canada.

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible to apply for the Horatio Alger Canadian Scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

Be enrolled full-time as a high school grade 11 or first-year CEGEP student in Canada

Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree program at an accredited university

Prove critical financial need (\$65,000 or less annual net income per family is required)

Demonstrate desire and ability to be entrepreneurial in a chosen field

Be involved in co-curricular and community service activities

Display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity

Maintain a minimum grade percentage of 70

Be Canadian citizens

Applicants for both the Entrepreneurial and Canadian Scholarships are required to fill out only ONE application. The Association will use the one application to consider you for all programs for which you are eligible.

**The application for current Grade 11 students is open annually December 1 to March 15.**

✱ **VERNA J. KIRKNESS EDUCATION FOUNDATION**

The Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation Program addresses the under-representation of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students at Canadian universities. One of the factors contributing to this is the lack of academic role models for Indigenous students.

Our Foundation addresses this by offering scholarships to Indigenous students in grades 11 and 12 to spend a week at a Canadian university, interacting with scientists in their research laboratories. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic our week-long program is offered and will return to in-person lab research when it is safe to do so. During the week instruction on campus (or virtually) the students have the opportunity to meet role models, learn about the support systems that are available to them on campus and experience the excitement of doing research. The Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation Program develops motivated role models who foster the importance of graduating from high school and obtaining a postsecondary education.
