A. INTRODUCTION

There are three main sources of financial aid for students who are planning to continue on to post-secondary education or training:

1. **SCHOLARSHIPS** – are offered to students of high academic and technical achievement. They may or may not require written exams. Criteria will also include leadership, creativity, community and school involvement, potential, citizenship, etc. Applications are available on-line or in the counselling office.
2. **BURSARIES** – are offered on the basis of student financial need, achievement, and other requirements.
3. **CANADA STUDENT LOANS, BC STUDENT LOANS AND BC GRANTS**
These loans and grants are accessed through a single application process. Eligibility is based on need and other criteria. Applications and details about Student Aid BC are available at: <https://studentaidbc.ca/>

B. DISTRICT/AUTHORITY SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

District/Authority Scholarships recognize graduating BC students for excellence in their chosen areas of interest or strength. These scholarships are intended to help students pursue post-secondary education.

The Ministry will allocate 5500 scholarships pro-rated to schools based on their September 30th Grade 12 enrolments. Winners receive a **\$1,250** voucher that can be used towards post-secondary education tuition.

To apply for a District/Authority Scholarship Award, ***you must complete the Ministry of Education District/Authority Scholarship Application form (found in the Counselling Office) and return it to Ms. Allan by no later than February 24th, 2023 at 1:00 pm:***

- Meet the following basic eligibility requirements:
 - Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) at the time of registration in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded;
 - Must be a BC resident
 - Must be a Vanier student in grade 12.
- Meet criteria determined by the local scholarship committee, which requires a student to demonstrate outstanding achievement in any of the following **focus areas** at school or in the community.
 - **Indigenous Languages and Culture**
 - **Fine Arts** (e.g., Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
 - **Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies** (e.g., Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics, Information Communication Technology)
 - **Physical Activity** (e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education)
 - **International Languages** from the International Languages Curriculum or External Assessments, including AP and IB courses
 - **Community Service** (Volunteer Activity), which includes awareness of local, global, and cultural issues
 - **Technical and Trades Training** (e.g., Carpentry, Automotive, Mechanics, Cook Training)
- Fulfill the BC graduation requirements of either the 2019 Graduation Program or the Adult Graduation Program by August 31st of the student's graduating year.

C. YOUTH WORK IN TRADES

Youth Work in Trades (formerly the Secondary School Apprenticeship Program) provides skill development through practical, hands-on work experience.

Students enrolled in these courses go to work and attend high school at the same time. That means they have found an employer who is willing to take them on (and pay them) as an apprentice.

Students who are eligible for the **Youth Work in Trades \$1,000.00 Award** will automatically be considered. There is no need to apply. To be eligible, students must have:

- Been registered with the Industry Training Authority as a Youth Apprentice
- Currently enrolled in high school in BC in Grade 10-12.
- Successfully complete WRK 11A, WRK 11B, WRK 12A, and WRK 12B
- Reported a total of at least 900 hours to the ITA by December 31 of the school year the student turns 19 **

* Note: A student's graduation transcript only includes the courses the student passes. The Youth Work in Trades Award uses all Grade 12 numbered courses in the calculation of the grade point average.

** To be eligible for a Youth Work in Trades Award, a student must complete 900 hours of work-based training by December 31 of the school year the student turns 19. The December 31 date ensures the awards will be ready for distribution during that school year. In some cases, students are unable to complete the required hours by December 31 due to circumstances beyond their control. To accommodate these students, a second cycle to verify work-based hours occurs in early September of the following school year. Those school-aged students who met the eligibility criteria on or before June 30 but were unable to complete or report their hours to the ITA by December 31, can still receive the award if they accrue the required work-based hours by August 31.

D. LOCAL BURSARIES AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Vanier Selected

Recipients are chosen by the Vanier Bursary Committee. Applications, the steps in the process and the list of Bursaries and Scholarships are with this booklet. The **Vanier Selected** application form is used.

Donor Selected

Recipients are chosen by local donor organizations. The applications and the steps in the process are with this booklet. The **Donor Selected** application form is used. (A few exceptions are noted in the bursary description.)

Online Donor Selected

Recipients are chosen by local donor organizations. Each organization has its own unique application form, different requirements, and sometimes different timelines. You are required to submit your application directly to the donor either online or by email. Please take note of application deadline specific for each bursary.

GETTING READY TO APPLY

STEPS

1. One letter of reference from teacher, member of the community, and/or employer.
2. Type a letter of introduction:
 - a) introduce yourself,
 - b) explain your post-secondary plans,
 - c) summarize your interests, activities, involvements, accomplishments etc.,
 - d) comment on your financial circumstances (if appropriate),
 - e) closing comment thanking committee for considering your application.
3. Obtain a copy of your transcript from MyEd or see Ms. Allan in the counselling office for copies.
4. Optional: Include your resume or Scholarship resume. This may be added to the application packages for Donor Selected applications.

VANIER SELECTED – HOW TO APPLY

STEPS

1. Complete Bursary application form **in full**. A fillable PDF application form can be downloaded from the Vanier website or a paper copy can be picked up from the Counselling Office.
2. Check off Vanier Selected Bursary form.
3. Read the description of each bursary and scholarship in the Vanier Selected category. **Make note of the ones for which you meet the criteria.**
4. On the Bursary Check List, put a “✓” in the box next to the title of the bursary/scholarship for which you want to be considered.

Staple your application package together in this order:

- a) the **Vanier Selected** application form (you only need to complete **one** application form)
 - b) Bursary Check List
 - c) a copy of your letter of introduction – addressed to the Vanier Bursary Committee
 - d) one copy of your reference letter
 - e) a copy of your transcript
5. Submit the stapled package to the Vanier Counselling Office by:

Friday, February 24th, 2023 no later than 1:00 pm.

DONOR SELECTED – HOW TO APPLY

STEPS

1. Complete Bursary application form **in full**. A fillable PDF application form can be downloaded from the Vanier website or a paper copy can be picked up from the Counselling Office.
2. Check off Donor Selected Bursary Application Form.
3. Read the descriptions of all Donor Selected Bursaries and Scholarships.
4. Determine which donor selected bursaries you will apply for.
5. For **each** Donor Selected Bursary/Scholarship you are applying to, complete one of the application forms and write/type the name of the donor selected bursary at the top.
6. Some of the donor selected bursary/scholarships have an additional application form that must be completed and attached to your donor selected bursary package. If a special application is required for a donor selected bursary, it will be mentioned in the description in the bursary booklet.
7. Edit your original Letter of Introduction, creating a copy for each individual organization (ie. Addressed to the organization and properly edited).
8. Make the appropriate number of copies of your letter of reference, transcripts, etc.
9. Staple each application package together in this order;
 - a) Special application form (if applicable – see bursary description/counselling office)
 - b) Application form with organization or bursary title filled in at the top
 - c) Letter of Introduction (edited)
 - d) Letter of reference (copied)
 - e) A copy of your transcript
 - f) (Optional) – resume or scholarship resume

ARDEN SPIRIT SCHOLARSHIP

The Arden Elementary School Parents Advisory Committee is pleased to offer a scholarship award of \$500.00 to a former Arden Elementary graduate who is enrolling in a post-secondary institution. The successful candidate must also be a Vanier graduate with a "B" average and evident good citizenship and community/school involvement.

AMOUNT: \$500

ARTHUR & PHYLLIS RAMSELL BURSARY

This bursary is provided from a fund established by Arthur & Phyllis Ramsell and administered by the Comox Valley Community Foundation. The recipient must be pursuing a career in the field of Health Care. The Ramsells are interested in supporting higher education firstly in the area of Nursing, and secondly in General Health Care. The successful candidates chosen post-secondary institution must be either a registered charity or a qualified donee registered with the Canada Revenue Agency.

AMOUNT: \$,1350

BETTINA HOLT LIBRARIAN BURSARY

This bursary is made available through the endowment of Bettina Holt, in memory of her father Frank Holt. Bettina was a librarian at the Courtenay District High School for 12 years from September 1955 to December 1967. Preference will be given to students proceeding to a university degree in librarianship. If no applicant meets this requirement, students proceeding to a university degree in English, History or Humanities will be eligible.

AMOUNT: \$500

BEULAH A. ROSS BURSARY

This bursary is provided from a fund established by the late Beulah A. Ross. Grade 12 students from Hornby Island are eligible. If no student applies, the award will be given to the Hornby Island School Library.

AMOUNT: \$100

BEV SKWERNUIK MEMORIAL BURSARY

The Bev Skwernuik Memorial Bursary is a \$500 scholarship awarded to a graduating high school student of the Comox Valley School District who will be attending post secondary education, and who has persevered through significant adversity during high school. An adverse event can be any of the following (but not limited to): death of a loved one; serious illness, injury, addiction, or acquired disability; dealing with abuse; significant disruption in family life.

AMOUNT: \$500

BRAD HARRIS MEMORIAL BURSARY

The recipient of this bursary has attended Royston Elementary School for a minimum of 4 years. Carrying with them the spirit of Royston Elementary School and its community throughout their school career.

The recipient may or may not achieve high grades but, more importantly, be community minded and contribute to their chosen community in a memorable way.

AMOUNT: \$500

CAREY MEMORIAL BURSARY (R.N. NORRIE)

Mrs. Ruth E. Donaldson has established a perpetual bursary in memory of her late husband, R. N. (Norrie) Carey. It is to be awarded to a disadvantaged student, whether that be physical, emotional, or financial, who has demonstrated perseverance in the face of adversity, and is limited to students pursuing academic or vocational training. The Vanier Bursary Committee will select the recipient.

Amount: \$750

CITY OF COURTENAY BURSARY

The City of Courtenay recognizes that youth have unlimited potential, and those who put forth efforts to make Courtenay a better place, need to be encouraged, recognized, and celebrated. By providing a bursary fund, the City intends to encourage community involvement, and assist young people in their pursuit of further education including lifestyle development training. Bursaries are for graduating students in grade 12 attending one of the following schools: Nala'atsi Alternate School, Glacier View Secondary, Mark R. Isfeld Secondary, Georges P. Vanier Secondary, Navigate (NIDES), and Gagliardi Academy. Students should demonstrate community involvement, volunteerism, successful academic standing and positive work habits.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident.
- Must not have previously received a bursary from the City of Courtenay Bursary Program.
- Must be a student from one of the schools listed above.
- Must be a City of Courtenay resident.
- Community involvement, volunteerism, participation in extra-curricular activities (i.e. athletics, drama, special interest clubs, successful academic standing and positive work habits).
- Students who demonstrate a financial need will be given priority.
- The student is to be awarded based on the previous year's achievements, contingent on continued positive involvement in the community and citizenship.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

COMOX DISTRICT TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION GRAD BURSARY

The Comox District Teachers' Association (CDTA) offer bursaries for graduating students. There is one \$500 award to Vanier graduates with a preference given to a student who intends to proceed into a Teacher Education Program.

Upon receiving the bursary award (chosen by the Vanier Bursary Committee), the recipient shall send a letter to the CDTA giving a brief description on how they will use the funds with a graduation photo for the CDTA newsletter. The graduating students shall then receive a cheque from the Association. This bursary may be held for the student for up to one year if the student requests.

AMOUNT: \$500

COMOX VALLEY MONARCH LIONS CLUB BURSARY

The Comox Valley Monarch Lions Club, chartered in 1992, is proud to be one of 46,000 International Lions Clubs comprised of over 1.4 million members throughout the world.

The bursary program is one of many local community commitments, and is an integral aspect of the Lions Motto, "We Serve".

This bursary will be given to a graduating student who is proceeding on to a trades or technical vocation. In keeping with the Lions International Motto "We Serve", the successful student must exhibit exemplary citizenship and public/community service.

Enrolment at a recognized post-secondary institution within one year of awarding the bursary must be proven to receive it.

AMOUNT: \$1,000 x 2

COMOX VALLEY PRINCIPALS & VICE-PRINCIPALS ASSOC. BURSARY

The Comox Valley Principals & Vice-Principals Association is pleased to award two bursaries of \$750.00 each to Vanier graduates. These bursaries will be awarded to students proceeding to a college, university or vocational institute.

Guidelines for selection are:

1. The student must be proceeding to an approved post-secondary institution.
2. The student must have made a contribution of service to the school or community at large.
3. Graduates will have up to 24 months to claim their bursary.

AMOUNT: \$750 x 2 (academic/vocational)

COMOX VALLEY REGIONAL DISTRICT BURSARY

The Comox Valley Regional District encourages and supports educational pursuits in the area of water services, wastewater services and environmental studies.

1. Proof of registration and attendance at a relevant Canadian accredited post-secondary institution in one of the following programs:
 - Environmental Operators Certification Program training
 - Environmental Engineering
 - Environmental Sciences
2. Involvement in extra-curricular activities.
3. Letter of introduction as stipulated by the respective school's bursary application process.
4. Two letters of reference from a non-relative.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

COMOX VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT BURSARY – CHRISTOPHER KLEIN-BEEKMAN

The Comox Valley School District offers a bursary to a student who is pursuing a full-time program of studies at a post-secondary or skills training institution. Criteria will include academic standing, financial need, and demonstration of service to the school or community at large.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

On Hornby she helped found many community institutions including the co-op store, credit union, library, and seniors housing. She was first Chair of the Islands Trust from 1974 to 1976. To preserve and protect her Heron Rocks property Hilary and friends created the Heron Rocks Friendship Centre Society (HRFCS) in 1989. The Society works to sustain Hilary's visions including support for Hornby Island youth pursuing further education to become active community members. To that end the HRFCS created the Hilary Brown Memorial (HBM) Bursary.

To receive the HBM Bursary the student must attend an accredited post-secondary program at a public university or college (vocational or academic). They must live on Hornby Island now or have taken a significant portion of their earlier schooling on Hornby. The awarded HBM Bursary is available for two years allowing for a gap year. The bursary may be paid when registration for the program is complete or directly to the post-secondary institution.

AMOUNT: \$500

HORNBY ISLAND CO-OP "MCPHERSON" BURSARY

Alicia was constantly striving to better her education and sought challenging positions to maximize her ability to contribute which led her into politics in the late 80's and she was elected as the first woman mayor in the Valley. Among her last wishes was a desire to continue to give back to her home community through scholarships. She wished these to be in memory of two members of her family who predeceased her and were very important to her. These two individuals were her mother Florence Burns and her younger brother Tim.

The Timothy Burns Bursary is an annual bursary presented to a student at G.P. Vanier in memory of Timothy. He was born the youngest of eight children and was raised entirely by a single parent as his father died when he was just eight months old. He grew up in the Valley and was known for his sense of humour. Tim attended various Valley schools, one being Vanier. Sports were very important to Tim, who excelled in cross country running, basketball and baseball. There are still trophies at Valley schools bearing his name. At age 19 Tim died of an inoperable malignant brain tumor.

This bursary is to be given out for more than just academic achievement. It is to be given to students who were involved with athletics, but not just "jocks"; who participated in student government and other activity clubs; and who were raised by a single parent or faced other challenging backgrounds. Also, its importance is to help a student who is adventurous and wants to push their limits by seeking to move their horizons beyond the familiar grounds of the Comox Valley. Both Alicia and Tim felt it was essential that we should experience and learn from those outside our normal circle of family, friends and community.
