

ADULTING 101: PERSONAL FINANCE FOR STUDENTS PREPARING FOR COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY

A Zoom-based financial literacy workshop for grade 9 to 12 students from UVIC's Gustavson School of Business

<u>Surveys</u> routinely show Canadians <u>struggle</u> with their finances—over half <u>are within \$200</u> of not being able to cover their bills and debt payments.

High school and university students particularly face struggles. <u>Rising student debt</u>, increasing housing costs, and surging inflation are barriers to success. *Generation Z* not only faces the burdens of climate change, the pandemic, and global uncertainty—but costs alone are a barrier to progress in careers and life.

So, how can students prepare for the costs of "adulting" and identify opportunities while at university?

The Gustavson School of Business at UVic invites students to join a free financial literacy workshop. Dr. Michael King leads this interactive session for students to strengthen and prepare their financial footing to enter university life. This workshop will give you a taste of Gustavson and finance through a fun and engaging session.

The workshop will be delivered on Zoom, and there are two dates to choose from:





ADAPT PROGRAM May 24, 2023



On the morning of Tuesday May 24, 2023, all grade 10 students will be taking part in the ADAPT program at Vanier from 9:10am – 12:00pm. Please have your student arrive on time this day, as the program will start at 9:15am sharp. Students will be expected to go to their first block class (B Block) and wait to be called down.

The ADAPT (Alcohol & Drug Awareness and the prevention of Trauma) Program is an injury prevention program that will provide students with a realistic look at the impact of poor decision-making and the immediate and long-term consequences of trauma. Through the lens of health care providers, students follow the journey of a trauma victim from injury occurrence, to transport, to treatment. Health care professionals and

community volunteers that include physicians, paramedics, police, MADD Canada, and trauma survivors will share their experiences and provide students with strategies for mitigating risk.



The program refers to real life scenarios and concrete ways students can stay safe. For any student who has experienced a traumatic incident, participation in this program may not be appropriate and should be carefully considered. We will encourage students to seek resources and supports if they feel upset by the content of the program. If you wish your child to NOT attend the program, please call the main office at Vanier at 250-338-9262 in advance of the program date of May 24, 2023 and an alternate space will be arranged. School counsellors will be available on site during and after the presentation.
