#### The Graduation Ceremony

 Location - Comox Valley Exhibition Grounds - Rotary Bowl Gates open at 3:00 pm (tentative time) with ceremony commencing at 4:00 pm





**Plan B –** Indoor Grad Ceremony if weather prevents outdoor ceremony.

Location - Sports Centre Rink 1

Tickets may be limited depending on seating capacity

Doors open at 3:00 pm (tentative time) with ceremony commencing at 4:00 pm





As arrival time does not change, students should be at school between 1:30 and 2:00 pm whether participating in the Grad Car Cruise or not, for grad pictures. Snacks will be provided as we know it is a long day. The evening will end at 7:00 pm.

### Careers and Capstone

#### These courses are a requirement for graduation.

Capstone and Careers teachers will be working closely with students to fulfill the requirements of both the Careers course and the Capstone project. If you have not completed your Careers and Capstone already, you will need to communicate with your teacher about a plan of action and due date.

Careers 12, Capstone, and online distance courses (if needed for grad) must be completed before grad tickets are handed out.
