#### Vanier Admin Report to PAC

#### January 2025

Term 2 is rapidly ending – in fact there are three days left in semester one. Students are beginning to write their final assessments and present their final projects. January grads are wrapping up their Careers 12 and Capstone projects, as they plan for dual credit, trades programs, or the next stage in their life. The last two months have been a busy one at Vanier. Citizenship projects were taken on with gusto during December, with the school filling the cafeteria with the hamper items they collected for 27 families in the Valley. Several classes supported the EDAS project (Everyone Deserves A Smile campaign), that put together 1400+ gift packages across the district for the homeless, including hats/scarves/gloves/warm socks/gifts/and cookies. The leadership 9-12 class and the Prime Minister and Deputy Prime Minister put on a great Winter Assembly on the last day before the winter break.

Students in grade 10 English and Math classes wrote their Numeracy and Literacy Assessments last week. Both of these tests must be written before they graduate and are only offered certain days of the school year. Please check in with the office staff if your child was not able to be here for their test. Students should be submitting any missing assignments, working on final projects, science fair, preparing for final exams, and/or completing their Careers 11/12/Capstone materials. Report cards will be issued February 5<sup>th</sup> online.

The school has a number of tests and surveys coming up in the next few months. We have the Program for International Student Assessment (approximately 40 grade 10's), and Student Learning Survey (grades 10, 11, and 12, parents and staff). All of these surveys will be completed between now and just after spring break.

Course selection for 2025-2026 will be beginning in February, with students picking their courses February 24 to February 28<sup>th</sup>. Information for parents and students will be Thursday February 20<sup>th</sup>, starting at 6:30 pm.

In Athletics, our ski and snowboard team has 30 athletes having fun and racing on Mount Washington. Mondays are race days, and the provincials will be held in Whistler for those who qualify. The district wrestling program is run out of Vanier, with students practicing three times a week. 9 Vanier athletes have been competing and doing very well. Basketball is well underway with a home tournament almost every weekend. Over 100 Vanier students are coming out to teams at grade 8, 9, junior and senior levels.

Island Health has hosted an optional HPV vaccination clinic at Vanier this week, over lunch in the multipurpose room. Students in grade 11 or 12 are encouraged to drop in and get protected. Grade 9's are also schedule to be immunized in February, and packages have been sent home this week with more information.

Our Winterfest evening was a huge success! Students enjoyed the slideshow of baby pictures paired with current pictures, then games of skill and chance (blackjack, roulette, craps, poker) to be able to bid on prizes. Thanks to our very generous community, some very lovely gifts were available as

prizes. Grad Attire continues to provide everything needed on graduation day, completely free of charge. More information can be found at

The next big grad item is Bursaries and Scholarships which packages will be available January 31<sup>st</sup>, and applications are due March 7 at 1 pm (not accepted late). Last year over \$100,000 was given out at Vanier's Bursary Night thanks to the generous support of our community, so we encourage all grade 12 students to apply. Next fun event is Spring BBQ.

# Presentation from Joe Heslip (Associate Superintendent) & Karma Taiji (District Principal of Equity, Diversity & Anti-Discrimination)

Karma's role is new and .5 or half-time position. With this position, there will be three areas of focus: anti-racism, SOGI, and mental health. Also looking at capacity building within the district, which is not just one person's work, we all need to build our capacity to do the work and recognize racism. The current focus is on the adults to build supports for students. Reach out by email with questions.

Joe's work with the Equity Scan: (complex topic please excuse brevity) Previous work at the Ministry of Education and Childcare (MOEC) through five years of Equity Scans across the province. Equity Scan explained in a bundle: there are four areas we need to work in (Powerpoint reference.) 1) Policy & Governance (maintain barriers or reduce barriers); 2) Learning Environment (how do we view Indigenous students and families and encountering racism); 3) Learning Profile (data to track graduation trajectory); 4) Pedagogical Core (embed Indigenous worldview)

Equity in Action - A Framework for Equity: Create a District Equity Skills Team, Conduct Scan, Create District Equity Profile, Develop Theory of Change, Define Goals and Set Equity Action Plans. Video and slideshow resources available.
