



- •Students Grade 10 12 courses count for graduation.
- must have 80 credits to graduate, 52 of these are from required courses. Careers (4 credits), must also be done in order to graduate - Career Connections and a Capstone Project, and Indigenous Focused Course work (EFP 11)
- Semester course = 4 credits
- Term course = 2 credits
- Graduation Numeracy (10) Literacy Assessment (10/12)

- Foundations and Pre-calculus Mathematics 10 or Workplace Mathematics 10
