

Our ski team wrapped up their season with a trip to Whistler, highlighted by one athlete qualifying for the snowboarding provincials at Troll Mountain, just south of Prince George. Our wrestling team also had a strong showing, sending a large contingent to provincials and earning multiple podium finishes.




Music Department on the Move
