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A. INTRODUCTION

There are three main sources of financial aid for students who are planning to continue to post-secondary education or training:

1. **SCHOLARSHIPS** – are offered to students of high academic and technical achievement. Criteria will also include leadership, creativity, community and school involvement, potential, citizenship, etc.
2. **BURSARIES** – are offered on the basis of student financial need, achievement, and other requirements.
3. **CANADA STUDENT LOANS, BC STUDENT LOANS AND BC GRANTS**
These loans and grants are accessed through a single application process. Eligibility is based on need and other criteria. Applications and details about Student Aid BC are available at: <https://studentaidbc.ca/>

B. DISTRICT/AUTHORITY SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

District/Authority Scholarships recognize graduating BC students for excellence in their chosen areas of interest or strength. These scholarships are intended to help students pursue post-secondary education.

The Ministry will allocate 5500 scholarships pro-rated to schools based on their September 30th Grade 12 enrolments. Winners receive a **\$1,250** voucher that can be used towards post-secondary education tuition.

To apply for a District/Authority Scholarship Award, ***you must complete the Ministry of Education District/Authority Scholarship Application form (found in the Counselling Office or fillable form on our website) and return it to Shannon in the counselling office by no later than March 7th, 2025 at 1:00 pm:***

- Meet the following basic eligibility requirements:
 - Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) at the time of registration in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded;
 - Must be a BC resident
 - Must be a Vanier student in grade 12.
- Meet criteria determined by the local scholarship committee, which requires a student to demonstrate outstanding achievement in any of the following **focus areas** at school or in the community.
 - **Indigenous Languages and Culture**
 - **Fine Arts** (e.g., Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
 - **Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies** (e.g., Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics, Information Communication Technology)
 - **Physical Activity** (e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education)
 - **International Languages** from the International Languages Curriculum or External Assessments, including AP and IB courses
 - **Community Service** (Volunteer Activity), which includes awareness of local, global, and cultural issues
 - **Technical and Trades Training** (e.g., Carpentry, Automotive, Mechanics, Cook Training)
- Fulfill the BC graduation requirements of either the 2025 Graduation Program or the Adult Graduation Program by August 31st of the student's graduating year.

C. YOUTH WORK IN TRADES

Youth Work in Trades provides skill development through practical, hands-on work experience.

Students enrolled in these courses go to work and attend high school at the same time. That means they have found an employer who is willing to take them on (and pay them) as an apprentice and are at least 16 years of age.

Students will become eligible to apply for the Youth Work in Trades \$1000 scholarship once they have:

- Been registered with SkilledTradesBC as a Youth Apprentice
- Currently enrolled in high school in BC in Grade 10-12.

- Successfully complete WRK 11A, WRK 11B, WRK 12A, and WRK 12B
- Reported a total of at least 900 hours to SkilledTradesBC by December 31 of the school year the student turns 19 **

* Note: A student's graduation transcript only includes the courses the student passes. The Youth Work in Trades Scholarship uses all Grade 12 numbered courses in the calculation of the grade point average.

** To be eligible for a Youth Work in Trades Scholarship, a student must complete 900 hours of work-based training by December 31 of the school year the student turns 19. The December 31 date ensures the scholarship applications are ready for distribution during that school year. In some cases, students are unable to complete the required hours by December 31 due to circumstances beyond their control. To accommodate these students, a second cycle to verify work-based hours occurs in early September of the following school year. Those school-aged students who met the eligibility criteria on or before June 30 but were unable to complete or report their hours to SkilledTradesBC by December 31, may still receive the scholarship if they accrue the required work-based hours by August 31.

D. LOCAL BURSARIES AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Vanier Selected

Recipients are chosen by the Vanier Bursary Committee. The steps in the process and the list of bursaries and scholarships available are in this booklet. The **Vanier Selected Checklist** must be completed (last page of application form).

Donor Selected

Recipients are chosen by local donor families / organizations. The steps in the process and the list of bursaries and scholarships available are in this booklet.

Online Donor Selected

Recipients are chosen by local donor organizations. Each organization has its own unique application form, different requirements, and sometimes different timelines. You are required to submit your application directly to the donor either online or by email. Please take note of application deadline specific for each bursary.

F. GETTING READY TO APPLY

1. Obtain one letter of reference from teacher, member of the community, and/or employer.
2. Type a letter of introduction:
 - a) introduce yourself,
 - b) explain your post-secondary plans,
 - c) summarize your interests, activities, involvements, accomplishments etc.,
 - d) comment on your financial circumstances (if appropriate),
 - e) closing comment thanking committee for considering your application.
3. Obtain a copy of your transcript from MyEdBC or see Shannon in the counselling office for a copy after Feb 10.
4. Optional: Include your resume. This may be added to the application packages for Donor Selected applications.

G. VANIER SELECTED – HOW TO APPLY

STEPS

1. Complete the bursary application form **in full**. A fillable PDF application form can be downloaded from the Vanier website or a paper copy can be picked up from the Counselling Office.
2. Check off “Vanier Selected Bursary Application Form” at the top of the page
3. Read the description of each bursary and scholarship in the Vanier Selected category. **Make note of the ones for which you meet the criteria.**
4. On the Bursary Check List located at the very back of the application form, put a “✓” in the box next to the title of the bursary/scholarship for which you want to be considered.
5. Staple your application package together in this order:
 - the **Vanier Selected** application form (you only need to complete **one** application form)
 - a copy of your letter of introduction – addressed to the Vanier Bursary Committee
 - one copy of your reference letter
 - a copy of your transcript
6. Submit the stapled package to the Vanier Counselling Office by **Friday, March 7th, 2025 by 1:00 pm.**

H. DONOR SELECTED – HOW TO APPLY

STEPS

1. Read the descriptions of all Donor Selected Bursaries and Scholarships in our Bursary Booklet available online.
2. Determine which donor selected bursaries you will apply for.
3. For **each** Donor Selected Bursary/Scholarship you are applying to, complete one of the application forms. Check off “Donor Selected Bursary Application Form” at the top of the page and write/type the name of the donor selected bursary at the top.
4. Some of the donor selected bursary/scholarships have an additional application form that must be completed and attached to your donor selected bursary package. If a special application form is required for a donor selected bursary, it will be mentioned in the description in the bursary booklet and you can find the form in the counselling office.
5. Edit your original Letter of Introduction, creating a copy for each individual organization (ie. Addressed to the organization and properly edited).
6. Make the appropriate number of copies of your letter of reference, transcripts, etc.
7. Staple your application package together in this order:
 - special application form (if applicable – refer to Bursary Booklet)
 - Vanier Bursary Application Form with organization or bursary title filled in at top
 - a letter of introduction
 - a letter of reference
 - a copy of your transcript
 - (optional) – a copy of your resume
8. Submit the stapled package to the Vanier Counselling Office by **Friday, March 7th, 2025 by 1:00 pm.**

ARDEN SPIRIT AWARD

The Arden Elementary School Parents Advisory Committee is pleased to offer a scholarship award of \$500.00 to a former Arden Elementary graduate who is enrolling in a post-secondary institution. The successful candidate must also be a Vanier graduate with a "B" average and evident good citizenship and community/school involvement.

AMOUNT: \$500

ARTHUR & PHYLLIS RAMSELL BURSARY

This bursary is provided from a fund established by Arthur & Phyllis Ramsell and administered by the Comox Valley Community Foundation. This award is intended to provide financial support to students pursuing a career in health care through post-secondary studies at a college, university, or school. Preference will be given to those pursuing nursing, and thereafter any career in general health care.

AMOUNT: \$1,400

BARBARA BERNDL TEACHING BURSARY

Barbara Berndl graduated from Vanier with Honours in June 1981. She entered the University of Victoria that year and proceeded toward a Bachelor of Education degree in the elementary field. She maintained academic excellence over the next four years and was completing a very successful practicum when tragedy struck. Barbara died in a car accident on April 23, 1985.

Barbara will be remembered by all who knew her, as she passed through our education system and various community groups. Courtenay Elementary, Lake Trail Junior and Vanier Secondary schools all benefited from her academic and extra-curricular activities. In the community, she was active in St. Georges United Church, the Courtenay Recreation Association in gymnastics, and many outdoor recreational activities. Barbara made a lasting impression on those she worked with and was appreciated by everyone.

A bursary fund was provided by Barbara's family and friends in memory of her. Each year, graduates of Vanier Secondary School proceeding to a university and a career in teaching are eligible to apply for the bursary, and thereby remember Barbara.

AMOUNT: \$300

BEECHER DEVELOPMENT LTD. FUND BURSARY – UNIVERSITY STUDIES

This bursary is available thanks to the Beecher Development Ltd. Fund and administered by the Comox Valley Community Foundation. It is offered to a student who is pursuing an academically orientated course of post-secondary study. The successful candidate must ordinarily reside within the Comox Valley School District and be pursuing post-secondary studies at a college, university, or school. Preference will be given to candidates with financial need.

AMOUNT: \$2,100

BEECHER DEVELOPMENT LTD. FUND BURSARY – TRADES

This bursary is available thanks to the Beecher Development Ltd. Fund and administered by the Comox Valley Community Foundation. It is offered to a student who is pursuing a trades course of post-secondary study. The successful candidate must ordinarily reside within the Comox Valley School District and be pursuing post-secondary studies at a college, university, or school. Preference will be given to candidates with financial need.

AMOUNT: \$2,100

BEULAH A. ROSS BURSARY

This bursary is provided from a fund established by the late Beulah A. Ross. Grade 12 students from Hornby Island are eligible. If no student applies, the award will be given to the Hornby Island School Library.

AMOUNT: \$100

BOWSER LEGION #211 BURSARY

Both the bursary and scholarship are open to graduating students of Georges P. Vanier Secondary School who

- Reside in the Qualicum Bay, Bowser, Deep Bay, Fanny Bay, Union Bay, Denman Island and Hornby Island areas, and
- Whose parents or grandparents (natural or legal) meet one of the following guidelines:
 - War veteran or member of the Armed Forces, or
 - Active member of RCL #211 Bowser.

Should there be no candidates that meet the geographical qualification, the Royal Canadian Legion # 211 will leave it open to the discretion of the school. Our objective in this endeavor is to help the graduating generation to the best of our ability to carry on a high standard of citizenship.

Bursary: Applications will first be judged based on financial need followed by qualities of leadership in the school and community; and qualities which indicate special achievement or promise.

Scholarship: Applicants will be chosen based on scholastic achievement (minimum 3.85 GPA) and have demonstration of community leadership.

The candidates must be proceeding to a Canadian university, BCIT, a registered school of nursing, or a vocational school. This award must be utilized by December of the next year following graduation.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

BRAD HARRIS MEMORIAL BURSARY

The recipient of this bursary has attended Royston Elementary School for a minimum of 4 years. Carrying with them the spirit of Royston Elementary School and its community throughout their school career.

The recipient may or may not achieve high grades but, more importantly, be community minded and contribute to their chosen community in a memorable way.

AMOUNT: \$500

CAREY MEMORIAL BURSARY (R.N. NORRIE)

Mrs. Ruth E. Donaldson has established a perpetual bursary in memory of her late husband, R. N. (Norrie) Carey. It is to be awarded to a disadvantaged student, whether that be physical, emotional, or financial, who has demonstrated perseverance in the face of adversity, and is limited to students pursuing academic or vocational training.

AMOUNT: \$750

CITY OF COURTENAY BURSARY

The City of Courtenay recognizes that youth have unlimited potential, and those who put forth efforts to make Courtenay a better place, need to be encouraged, recognized, and celebrated. By providing a bursary fund, the City intends to encourage community involvement, and assist young people in their pursuit of further education including lifestyle development training. Bursaries are for graduating students in grade 12 attending one of the following schools: Nala'atsi Alternate School, Glacier View Secondary, Mark R. Isfeld Secondary, Georges P. Vanier Secondary, Navigate (NIDES), and Gaglardi Academy. Students should demonstrate community involvement, volunteerism, successful academic standing and positive work habits.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident.
- Must not have previously received a bursary from the City of Courtenay Bursary Program.
- Must be a student from one of the schools listed above.
- Must be a City of Courtenay resident.
- Community involvement, volunteerism, participation in extra-curricular activities (i.e. athletics, drama, special interest clubs, successful academic standing and positive work habits).
- Students who demonstrate a financial need will be given priority.
- The student is to be awarded based on the previous year's achievements, contingent on continued positive involvement in the community and citizenship.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

COMOX DISTRICT TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION GRAD BURSARY

The Comox Valley Teachers' Association are teachers in School District No.71, who offer a bursary for graduating students. There is one \$500.00 award to a G.P. Vanier graduate, with a preference given to a student who intends to proceed into a Teacher Education Program.

AMOUNT: \$500

COMOX VALLEY PRINCIPALS & VICE-PRINCIPALS ASSOC. BURSARY

The Comox Valley Principals & Vice-Principals Association is pleased to award two bursaries of \$750.00 each to Vanier graduates. These bursaries will be awarded to students proceeding to a college, university or vocational institute.

Guidelines for selection are:

1. The student must be proceeding to an approved post-secondary institution.
2. The student must have made a contribution of service to the school or community at large.
3. Graduates will have up to 24 months to claim their bursary.

AMOUNT: \$750 x 2 (academic/vocational)

COMOX VALLEY REGIONAL DISTRICT BURSARY

The Comox Valley Regional District encourages and supports educational pursuits in the area of water services, wastewater services and environmental studies.

1. Proof of registration and attendance at a relevant Canadian accredited post-secondary institution in one of the following programs:
 - Environmental Operators Certification Program training
 - Environmental Engineering
 - Environmental Sciences
2. Involvement in extra-curricular activities.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

COMOX VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT BURSARY – CHRISTOPHER KLEIN-BEEKMAN

The Comox Valley School District offers a bursary to a student who is pursuing a full-time program of studies at a post-secondary or skills training institution. Criteria will include academic standing, financial need, and demonstration of service to the school or community at large.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

DELORES WOODIE BURSARY

This bursary is provided to support students in the Comox Valley pursue post-secondary education at a public university or college of their choice.

AMOUNT: \$1,100

FILBERG HERITAGE LODGE & PARK ASSOCIATION BURSARY

This bursary is to be presented to a graduating student entering studies at a B.C. college or university in the field of History and/or Horticulture. This award is made possible by the generosity of our members.

AMOUNT: \$500

GEOFF LONGLAND ENGINEERING BURSARY

For a deserving student whose ordinary residence is in the Comox Valley, who is attending G.P. Vanier Senior Secondary, and who is pursuing or entering a course of post-secondary study in Engineering at University of British Columbia.

AMOUNT: \$800

GEORGE T. COCHRANE SCHOLARSHIP

In favour of one or more deserving students who attended GP Vanier Secondary School and will be attending post-secondary studies in the field of Education.

AMOUNT: \$500

GLEND & PAUL WILSON TRIPLE S AWARD

The Triple S (Scholarship, Service, and Sport) Bursary has been established by Glenda Wilson (nee Ash) Courtenay High grad 1960, and Paul Wilson, Cumberland High grad 1959, in gratitude to the School District for the positive schooling, memories, and accomplishments of themselves and their children.

The \$2000 award is open to pupils finishing their secondary education and residing in School District 71, who will be pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited institution. The successful applicant must demonstrate proficiency in the three areas of scholarship, service, and sport.

AMOUNT: \$2000

HAROLD W. HEMSWORTH MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary is provided by the estate of the late Harold W. Hemsworth. Harold, together with his parents, George and Elsie Gwen Hemsworth, moved to Royston in 1937. He attended Royston Elementary School and completed his education at Courtenay High School. Harold's main interests were music and hiking. He played the piano and saxophone and had a dance band in his early years. Harold hiked all of the trails in the surrounding area. Harold had an interest in automotive mechanics and drove a district school bus for a number of years, as well as a public transportation bus. Later, he worked as a service station attendant at Anchor Garage and then as a store clerk until retirement. He was a lifelong learner and had an extensive library of books and music. He loved to quiz his family and friends about important dates in history.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

HORNBY ISLAND NEW HORIZONS SOCIETY BURSARY

Hornby Island New Horizons Society offers an annual bursary of \$1000.00 to a grade 12 graduate of School District #71, Comox Valley. The recipient will have attended a minimum of 2 years at Hornby Island Elementary School and will be enrolled in a post-secondary institution in a program leading to a diploma or degree.

New Horizons will issue a cheque to the recipient, upon receipt of proof of registration at an appropriate institution. Acceptance of this bursary may be deferred for up to one year upon written request to the New Horizons Board.

AMOUNT: \$1,000 – pending

JAMES SMALL MEMORIAL BURSARIES

These bursaries are provided from the estate of the late James Small, who bequeathed these funds in appreciation of the medical team who treated him after a massive heart attack. This estate represents many years of hard work in Vancouver Island forests. It is intended to assist a student whose aim is to become a progressive leader in promoting good health so the public will receive maximum benefit from Jim Small's hard-earned fortune.

Applicants must:

1. Be applying to a recognized public post-secondary institution within Canada or the United States to pursue a specific program in the medical field.
2. Be graduating from G.P. Vanier Secondary School.
3. Demonstrate excellent academic performance, particularly in science-related disciplines.
4. Be free of involvement with illicit drugs or other criminal activity.
5. Possess a high level of interpersonal skills including good communication skills and a flexible and co-operative attitude.
6. Demonstrate commitment to hard work and a dedication to start and complete tasks.
7. Demonstrate the need for financial assistance.

AMOUNT: \$2,500 x 2

JOE CLARKE MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary is provided as a memorial to the late Joseph Clarke. Mr. Clarke was a long-time resident of the Comox Valley and active in the Knights of Columbus, both 3rd and 4th degrees. Mr. Clarke took a great interest in the community and his fellow man and for this, received a number of recognitions including the "Family of The Year" award from the Knights of Columbus. This bursary will be awarded to a student with a high academic standing, actively involved in school and/or community affairs, and financial need will be an important consideration. This bursary will be awarded annually.

AMOUNT: \$500

THE EVELYN HILL-BEERS AND ROBERT BEERS KIWANIS CLUB OF COURTENAY BURSARY

The Kiwanis Club of Courtenay Bursary is to be awarded to a Vanier graduate who shows academic promise, demonstrates financial need, and has a record of school and/or community involvement.

AMOUNT: \$2,000

LESLEY LANE BURSARY

This bursary is presented in memory of Lesley Lane. It is to be presented to a Vanier graduate with a focus in Business. The recipient should be an overall well-rounded student who gives their best to their studies, the school, and their family and community.

AMOUNT: \$100

LORNE IRWIN BURSARY

This bursary will be awarded to a student who is proceeding to a post-secondary institution and attended Cumberland Community School.

AMOUNT: \$250

MCNISH FAMILY BURSARY

This bursary is designed to carry on our family tradition of participation in the community. The bursary will be awarded to the graduating student who best exhibits the attributes of citizenship and who participates and, if necessary, leads in community/school activities voluntarily and with interest.

AMOUNT: \$400

MEGAN DALZIEL MEMORIAL BURSARY

This bursary was created in memory of Megan Dalziel. Megan was an outstanding multi-sport athlete and a star basketball and volleyball player for three years at Vanier. She followed that up by helping UVIC win two CIAU national championships in four years (1998 & 2000). After university Megan taught and coached at York House. She is a member of the Vanier Athletics Hall of Fame. Megan was disarmingly humble, and her smile lit up all those around her. Her friendly disposition and inclusive positivity made her a favorite teammate wherever she went. She had time for everyone and is fondly remembered as one of the best people possible, and as an inspiration for all who met her.

This bursary will be awarded to the graduating Vanier female student who meets the following criteria:

- Has shown excellence in athletics and academics,
- Is pursuing post secondary education,
- Preference is given to students reflecting the personal attributes shown by Megan.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

NORTH ISLAND COLLEGE – DR. ALLAN DUNCAN PRITCHARD LEGACY BURSARY

Through his historic legacy gift to students, Dr. Pritchard is encouraging the next generation of students to enrich their lives, careers, and well-being through education. A lifelong learner and educator, Dr. Pritchard was also an accomplished writer, historian, cited expert on architecture, world traveler and philanthropist, but most of all, he was a kind and modest man. Today, the Pritchard legacy fund bursaries will support any student enrolled in any program at NIC.

This \$1,000 bursary will be awarded to a student who will be attending North Island College (NIC) between September 2025 and February 2026. The recipient will be enrolling in post-secondary level courses (not upgrading) and will have maintained a minimum C+ average in their Grade 12 year. The funds will be applied to tuition upon registration.

AMOUNT: \$1,000

PIERCY'S FUNERAL HOME MEMORIAL AWARD

Piercy's Funeral Home is pleased to offer this award annually in memory and in honour of those they serve. The successful candidate must be a graduate of G.P. Vanier who is proceeding directly to a recognized post-secondary institution in full-time enrolment. The applicant must be a well-rounded student who shows good academic achievement and be active in school and civic affairs.

AMOUNT: \$500

PUNTLEDGE PARK ALUMNI ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

This bursary will be awarded to a student who has attended École Puntledge Park Elementary and who demonstrates a keen understanding of environmental issues. Ideally the recipient will have showcased their commitment to environmental issues by initiating or participating in environmental clubs or outdoor programs within the school and/or the community.

AMOUNT: \$500

RANDY RAWSON NIGHTHAWK SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The 409 Squadron and friends of the late Randy Rawson have provided a bursary as a memorial to Randy. Randy was born in Comox on March 26, 1965 and lived in several Canadian provinces before the family returned to the Comox Valley where Randy completed his grade 12 graduation with honours from Vanier in June 1983. Randy was very active in school and community activities, including being a paper boy, a scout, a CRA volunteer, and a member of minor hockey and church youth groups. He joined the military services as an officer candidate and attended the Electrical Engineering Faculty of the University of Alberta in Edmonton. The whole community was shocked and saddened by his sudden death in a car accident on June 29, 1984. The bursary is awarded to a Vanier graduate who closely matches the personal attributes that Randy demonstrated.

AMOUNT: \$200

RICHARD JOHN SCOTT MACDONNELL MEMORIAL BURSARY

Family and friends of the late Scott MacDonnell, a Vanier graduate in 1992, have established a bursary to be awarded annually to a student proceeding to post-secondary education. The recipient of this bursary should be an active, positive member of the school community. He or she should be enrolled in a post-secondary institution within 27 months of high school graduation.

AMOUNT: \$500

RONALD RITCHIE MEMORIAL AWARD

This award in memory of Ronald Ritchie, a former teacher at GP Vanier, and will be presented to a student who has been outstanding in Biology 12.

AMOUNT: \$150

ROYAL LEPAGE IN THE COMOX VALLEY

Royal LePage in the Comox Valley is pleased to award a graduating grade 12 student pursuing post-secondary studies with this bursary. This award is made possible by the generosity of realtors at Royal LePage.

AMOUNT: \$500

RYAN VENDING BURSARY

This bursary will be awarded to a student pursuing post-secondary education in the field of business or marketing.

AMOUNT: \$500

THOMAS COOPER MEMORIAL BURSARY

The Thomas Cooper Memorial Bursary is to be awarded to a student who has excelled in Science Courses in their graduating year and has plans to go on to post-secondary education. This bursary rotates between the three secondary schools.

AMOUNT: \$600

VANCOUVER FOUNDATION/ROTARY CLUB OF COURTENAY BURSARIES

The Vancouver Foundation, in association with The Rotary Club of Courtenay, offers bursaries to graduates in the Comox Valley. To preserve and protect her Heron Rocks property Hilary and friends created the Heron Rocks Friendship Centre Society (HRFCS) in 1989. The Society works to sustain Hilary's visions including support for Hornby Island youth pursuing further education to become active community members. To that end the HRFCS created the Hilary Brown Memorial (HBM) Bursary.

To receive the HBM Bursary the student must attend an accredited post-secondary program at a public university or college (vocational or academic). They must live on Hornby Island now or have taken a significant portion of their earlier schooling on Hornby. The awarded HBM Bursary is available for two years allowing for a gap year. The bursary may be paid when registration for the program is complete or directly to the post-secondary institution.

AMOUNT: \$750

HORNBY ISLAND CO-OP MCPHERSON BURSARY

The Timothy Burns Bursary is an annual bursary presented to a student at G.P. Vanier in memory of Timothy. He was born the youngest of eight children and was raised entirely by a single parent as his father died when he was just eight months old. He grew up in the Valley and was known for his sense of humour. Tim attended various Valley schools, one being Vanier. Sports were very important to Tim, who excelled in cross country running, basketball and baseball. There are still trophies at Valley schools bearing his name. At age 19 Tim died of an inoperable malignant brain tumor.

This bursary is to be given out for more than just academic achievement. It is to be given to students who were involved with athletics, but not just “jocks”; who participated in student government and other activity clubs; and who were raised by a single parent or faced other challenging backgrounds. Also, its importance is to help a student who is adventurous and wants to push their limits by seeking to move their horizons beyond the familiar grounds of the Comox Valley. Both Alicia and Tim felt it was essential that we should experience and learn from those outside our normal circle of family, friends and community.
