The Grad Class Attire Project operates out of Comox Valley Dodge at 278 North Island Highway (Old Canadian Tire building) on the following dates:



Photo hints

 We currently have five days booked, from 10:30 AM to 6:00 PM, with a 40-minute break from 2:30 to 3:10 PM. There are 314 appointments available so far, and we can add more if needed. Retakes are scheduled for early Feb (3 days)

Based on Island Life's experience at other high schools, some students arrive not realizing it's grad photo day. In those cases, we're happy to accommodate drop-ins—we won't turn anyone away. Every year, a few students show up feeling overwhelmed or uninformed, and if they're willing, we take their photo on the spot.

GRAD PHOTO DAY PREPARATION - What You Need to Know

Your photo session will feature a variety of poses, including: gown-only, cap and gown, flowers prop, diploma prop, graduation sign prop, and personal item.



Facial Preparation

- · Wash your face to reduce oily shine.
- · Cover blemishes lightly-avoid heavy makeup.
- Be clean-shaven-stubble cannot be retouched in photos.

What to Wear

- Necklines: Wear a long or short-sleeved scoop or V-neck top to show your neckline.
- Dress Shirt & Tie: Bring your own or use one of ours (please wear a T-shirt underneath for easy changing).
- Turtleneck: A plain, non-patterned turtleneck is best to keep focus on your face.
- Avoid bulky clothing: Be prepared to remove hoodies or thick layers. Wear something lightweight so the gown fits properly over your outfit.

Other Important Notes

- Hands & Wrists: Your hands may appear in photos while holding flowers or the diploma prop.
- Check that fingernails are clean.
- Remove elastic bands from your wrists as they leave marks.
- Jewelry: Only wear necklaces that you want to be visible in your photos.
- Hats: Avoid wearing hats before your session, as they mess up your hair and can leave a mark on your forehead.

Arrival Time

Please arrive 5-10 minutes before your appointment to allow time to:

- · Get suited up in your cap and gown
- · Do a final check of your appearance

What to Expect

- We'll begin with a few photos without the cap to avoid flattening your hair.
- The assistant will bring your cap when it's time for those poses.
- Personal Item Photos: You'll have the option to include a personal item (like a jersey or medal) in a few photos.
- Wrap-Up: After your session, return to the entrance area, where a staff member will assist you in removing the gown and V-stole.

Viewing Your Photos

Your photo proofs will be ready 3-4 weeks after Picture Day.

A viewing link will be emailed to the Grad's school email, and a hand out will be provided for every Grad.


