For three of our teams, this was their first tournament and the first robot they had ever built: they worked hard, passed inspections, and competed in multiple games against all levels of teams. Our team 7842-Fractal made up of Zane Radawiec (Vanier), Levi Milligan (Vanier), and Laurian Blachford (Isfeld) took 1st place out of 31 teams and came home with the Tournament Champion Award. 7842-Fractal also won the Judge's Innovation Award for their unique design feature, their well-documented building progress in their Engineering Notebook, and the team's knowledge during judging interviews. Robotics 71 students have 2 weeks until their next tournament on Salt Spring Island.
