# Please review there have been some REVISIONS School Closures, Power Outages, Ferry Cancellations

- The school will be open when the power is out, unless there are adverse weather conditions, or a shortage of staff.
- If there are extreme weather conditions and/or power outages, please be sure to listen to the local radio stations at 97.3 The Eagle and/or 98.9 The Goat to see if SD71 has decided to close all schools. If you have internet access, you can also check the School District website for notices on school closures
  - https://www.comoxvalleyschools.ca/. Closures are usually announced by 6:30 AM.
- If School District #71 is closed due to weather conditions, HORNBY SCHOOL WILL ALSO BE CLOSED. THE PHONE TREE CALLOUT WILL NO LONGER TAKE PLACE.
- If ONLY the Hornby school is to be closed (this would be highly unusual), we will then e-mail families but WILL NO LONGER MAKE EMERGENCY PHONE TREE CALL-OUTS.
- If the power goes out during the day, we will continue regular operations, unless there is a decision to close for safety reasons or if there is an issue with our generator. If the

- decision to close the school is made once school is already in session, we will telephone parents/guardians/emergency contacts.
- It is **VERY** important we have your verification forms with alternate emergency contacts.
