#### **Sentinels of Change Field Trip to Ford Cove Dock with Natural History Stewards**

Throughout the spring, students have been visiting Ford Cove dock each Tuesday, accompanied by the Natural History stewards.

We have been monitoring a plankton trap and counting Dungeness crab larvae, which are then released.

The school visits have now finished for the year, but the study continues throughout the summer.

You are welcome to visit the dock throughout the summer on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday mornings at 9:15am. Meet at the top of the ramp.

The school visits will resume in Spring 2024. The study period is April 15-Sept 1.

It was so much fun having the students at the dock. They are good observers and very careful with the critters. Ask your child about what they saw.

**Community Partners:** The Hakai Institute manages the project. Hornby volunteer partners are Hornby Island Diving Ltd, Hornby Island Natural History Centre (HIES), Conservancy Hornby Island.

**Project Information:** The project will deploy and monitor a network of 25 plankton traps throughout the Salish Sea, and in Puget Sound. <a href="https://sentinels.hakai.org">https://sentinels.hakai.org</a> We are specifically looking at Dungeness crab larvae but will be looking at other species as well.

Am'lala sa Kumuxse' was created in July 2018 for Indigenous Education (School District 71) to be sung by all students to celebrate Kwakwaka'wakw culture and language. Am'lala sa Kumuxse' translates as 'Play Song of the K'omoux' and speaks to the great land "ila a hii" and the powerful ocean and rivers "skoo kum chuck" that are here within the lands of the K'omoux. The song was released into our School District in a ceremony held during a Professional Development Day on February 15, 2019.

#### **Methods of Communication**

At Hornby Island Community School, we know that communication between school and home is of great importance to a child's success at school. School staff share information frequently through the following pathways:

#### School Closures, Power Outages, Ferry Cancellations

Our procedures for power outages and ferry cancellations may affect regular operations of our school. If the power is out before school starts, the Principal/Vice Principal will contact the School District to decide on closing the school. If the school is to be closed, we will begin the emergency phone tree callouts. If the power goes out during the day, we will make a decision based on information we receive about how long we will be without power.

If there is an issue with our generator, we may need to close the school. If this is to happen, we will contact parents/guardians/emergency contacts. For this reason, and in the case of other emergencies, it is <u>VERY</u> important we have your verification forms with alternate emergency contacts. If School District #71 is closed due to weather conditions, Hornby School will also be closed unless otherwise stated. Again, the phone tree call-out will be in effect and all efforts will be made to ensure callouts happen early in the morning.

If there are power outages, we may not get through to your phone line so please be sure to listen to the local radio stations at 97.3 The Eagle and/or 98.9 The Goat. If you can, check the School District website for notices on school closures at:

https://www.comoxvalleyschools.ca/. Closures are usually announced by 6:30 AM.

Please note that the contact information we have on file is provided by parents at the beginning of the school year when you review and sign the student verification form. If there are any changes in contact information throughout the school year, please notify the school as soon as possible so we can update our system.
