Project Information: The project will deploy and monitor a network of 25 plankton traps throughout the Salish Sea, and in Puget Sound. <u>https://sentinels.hakai.org</u> We are specifically looking at Dungeness crab larvae but will be looking at other species as well.

Natural History Fossil Fair – May 13th

Millions of years ago, the ancient seas and forests of Hornby Island and the parts of the east coast of Vancouver Island were inhabited by ancient creatures and plants. From ammonites to Tylosaurus, and from sharks to seabirds, fossils are a record of this life. Come learn about these creatures and explore a variety of fossils from the Late Cretaceous epoch at the Hornby Island Natural History Centre's Fossil Fair.

On May 13th, drop in between 11:30 am – 3:00 pm on the deck of the Centre at 2100 B Sollans Rd. Paleontologists and community members will share their fossil discoveries. Bring your own fossils for identification. Kids can participate in fun-hands on activities. All ages are welcome.

Special guests from the Vancouver Island Paleontological Society will share displays and storyboards and help identify fossils. You can also see the star of our exhibit: a fossil of a large marine reptile called a Tylosaurus which could be 40 feet, as long as a school bus.

Questions for school district:

1) Space What spaces are currently available that could be used for a grade 8/9 program? What are our options for creating new space if it is needed?

2) Staffing, enrolment

What staff would be required to run this program? Teacher, EA, admin, community presenters, etc? What enrolment would be needed to make the proposed program viable? How would this proposed program intersect with current Wednesday school?

3) Making it Awesome - Hornby strengths, and making the program appealing and exciting How can SD71 support us in developing programming in these areas?

- Outdoors - physical education, connection to nature, field science

- Arts and Culture - visual arts, crafts, performance, media, Indigenous and non-Indigenous culture

- Sustainability - sustainable living, sustainable design and building, life skills (agriculture, food preparation, building, repairs, caregiving skills, etc)

- Increased enrolment - Denman students, exchange students, international students

Am'lala sa Kumuxse' was created in July 2018 for Indigenous Education (School District 71) to be sung by all students to celebrate Kwakwaka'wakw culture and language. Am'lala sa Kumuxse' translates as 'Play Song of the K'omoux' and speaks to the great land "ila a hii" and the powerful ocean and rivers "skoo kum chuck" that are here within the lands of the K'omoux. The song was released into our School District in a ceremony held during a Professional Development Day on February 15, 2019.

Methods of Communication

At Hornby Island Community School, we know that communication between school and home is of great importance to a child's success at school. School staff share information frequently through the following pathways:

School Closures, Power Outages, Ferry Cancellations

Our procedures for power outages and ferry cancellations may affect regular operations of our school. If the power is out before school starts, the Principal/Vice Principal will contact the School District to decide on closing the school. If the school is to be closed, we will begin the emergency phone tree callouts. If the power goes out during the day, we will make a decision based on information we receive about how long we will be without power.

If there is an issue with our generator, we may need to close the school. If this is to happen, we will contact parents/guardians/emergency contacts. For this reason, and in the case of other emergencies, it is <u>VERY</u> important we have your verification forms with alternate emergency contacts. If School District #71 is closed due to weather conditions, Hornby School will also be closed unless otherwise stated. Again, the phone tree call-out will be in effect and all efforts will be made to ensure callouts happen early in the morning.

If there are power outages, we may not get through to your phone line so please be sure to listen to the local radio stations at 97.3 The Eagle and/or 98.9 The Goat. If you can, check the School District website for notices on school closures at: https://www.comoxvalleyschools.ca/. Closures are usually announced by 6:30 AM.

Please note that the contact information we have on file is provided by parents at the beginning of the school year when you review and sign the student verification form. If there are any changes in contact information throughout the school year, please notify the school as soon as possible so we can update our system.
