It's been a quiet start to the new year. I hope everyone had a relaxing break. January-April is typically a key learning period in the school year. Classroom and school routines have been established and students are usually prepared and ready to learn. We're excited about the opportunities we'll be providing to support the current needs of our learners. - Social Emotional Learning (SEL) - Staff are recognizing the need to spend more time than usual on Social Emotional Learning. We know that SEL improves students' mental health, academic performance, and social relationships and it is the foundation for how we shape our character, emotional health, behavioral responses, motivations, and critical thinking skills. As a result, teachers will be implementing a new program, Everyday Speech, for students in grades 2-7. More information will be sent to families soon.
