Class Updates

Kindergarten/Grade 1 Update:

Although it was a short week, it was filled hands-on learning experiences. We began by exploring the importance of Truth and Reconciliation. Students approached the topic of Orange Shirt Day with great sensitivity and care, thoughtfully learning about its meaning. Each child designed their own orange shirt and colored beautiful illustrations of local animals created by Indigenous artists. In Science, we dug into the study of soil... literally! Using magnifying glasses, the students examined samples up close. During Career Education, we became ER veterinarians, rescuing and bandaging animals in imaginative play. In Art and ADST, students created mandalas and constructed ramps, showing both creativity and problem-solving skills. In Math, we focused on patterns and shapes, while in Literacy, we continued reviewing letters A, O, and C, and began exploring the letter D. We've organized reading groups, practiced blending letter sounds, and continued developing our story-writing skills. *The students are incredibly eager to read, and it's a joy to support them on this exciting journey.*



Grade 1-3 Update:

This week, our class has been busy learning in many different ways!

We started a new handball unit in P.E., where students are building their throwing, catching, and teamwork skills while also practicing fair play.

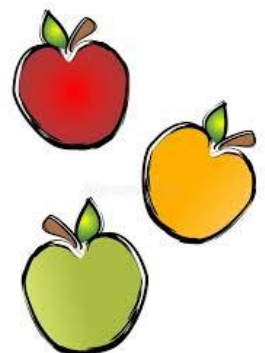

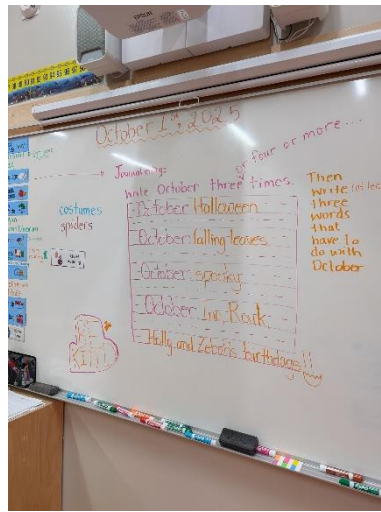

These projects help turn abstract concepts into concrete (mathematical) and creative representations.

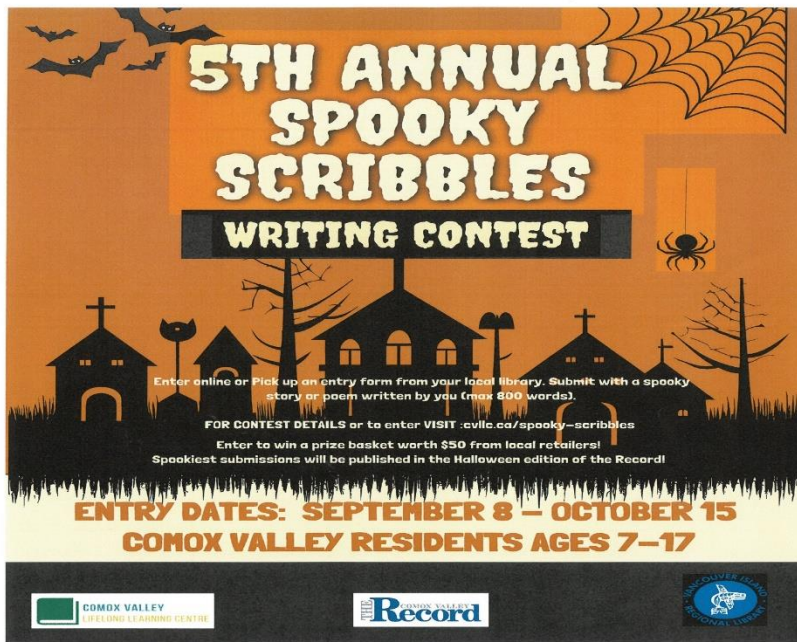

Hornby School Literacy Play-Dough

Ingredients

- 1 cup flour
- 1/2 cup salt
- 2 tsp cream of tartar **
- 1 Tbsp oil
- 1 cup water
- Food colouring and/or essential oils

Note: Cream of tartar helps preserve the play-dough for longer, but it is not essential.

Directions

1. Put all ingredients in a pot and mix together.
2. Heat over medium until it forms a ball (about 3 minutes).

3. Carefully transfer to a lightly floured table (it will be hot) and knead until smooth.
4. Portion into zipper bags, add food colouring/essential oils, and mix in the bag.
5. Store the dough in the same bag.

Literacy Ideas

- Roll long worms with the dough to form shapes and letters.
- Practice making names, words, and letters out of dough.
- Provide a letter on a wipeable mat/board and have your child match it with a play-dough worm.
- Roll worms and cut them into pieces using scissors or a bread knife.
- Make a **secret letter** and see if a partner can guess it by touch only.
- Flatten the dough and trace letters with a finger.
- Use cookie cutters to cut out letters, or press small objects (beans, shells, etc.) into dough to form letters.

Why Play-Dough for Literacy?

Playing with play-dough in these ways:

- Builds fine motor skills and hand strength needed for printing.
- Helps the brain form pathways about how letters are made.
- Engages the sensory system, supporting letter recognition, production, and memory.
