## **Lesson Series: Aboriginal People and Astronomy (Constellations) Learning Intentions:**

• I can understand stories Aboriginal people told about Constellations

#### **Learning Outcomes:**

Compare familiar constellations in seasonal skies. Demonstrates awareness of the special significance of celestial objects for First Nations peoples.

#### **Achievement Indictors:**

Generate specific questions in response to an Aboriginal story focusing on celestial objects Write their own stories, complete with picture on a celestial object (eg: how the moon came to be, why the sun is so hot).



#### **Materials:**

Skyteller DVD (Constellation Story), Blackline Masters– Anticipation Guide


Learning Intention poster

Copies of the star sheet for students to find their own constellations.

Muin and the seven Bird Hunters DVD

#### Lesson:

- 1) Introduce the learning intention.
- 2) Have students complete, Anticipation Guide about Constellations. What do you know about them? Have students share what their background knowledge is.
- 3) Together, fill in the questions section about constellations and Aboriginal People.
- 4) Optional: Share "Muin and Ntuksuinu'k story DVD
- 5) Discuss what this story represents. Why is it important? Share Skyteller Constellation section.
- 6) Option One: Divide the class into groups of five. Each group then selects a leader. Look at the stars and pick out an animal or object of some kind that you can see. Share suggestions for a story that could go with this picture. Do not write anything down (this is oral storytelling). Come up with one final story as a group that can be shared with the class.
- 7) Option Two: Hand out stickers. Have students decide on a shape that they are going to make. Create shape out of stickers on a black piece of black paper. Connect with straight lines out of white/ yellow pencil crayons. Create an oral story to go with it.
- 8) Share the stories orally. Talk about our stories—do they have a purpose beyond being fun? What about Aboriginal stories? Do they have a purpose beyond this?
- 9) Post lesson: Have students look at their Anticipation Guide and see how their thinking has changed from the start of the lesson.
