- Letter regarding contact tracing – omicron – attendance data from schools, compare to last years attendance for the same time, 10% absenteeism creates an activity signal

- Monitoring with Island Health, they will recommend a health closure (students) or functional closure (lack of staff to run school, teachers, EA's, have to exhaust deployments), will close a school min 5 days
 - Day 1 letter and student sent home, teacher prep for home learning
 - Day 2 make sure home has the ability to learn at home
 - Day 3 Remote learning begins, schools will be available for extra supports
- Letter to families from TDemeo out today outlining the functional closure process
- HR continuing the hiring process of all staffing for replacement of sick members
- Secondary programming (semester system) will look different from elementary
- What happens if there is a shortage of bus drivers? All aspects of operations are being addressed
- LP exposure notices helped with spread of Covid, are we more at risk with attendance tracking?
- TD change to notification due to the shorter incubation period of Omicron, still contact individually, no notice from SBO. Personal health checks are important, should be a priority. Continue to be diligent with mask, and hand hygiene. Stay home if you are not feeling 100%.
- HRB hygiene is well and good, more information given helps for decisions to choose what is best for a family
- TD schools are not being notified by island health of covid cases. Previous Island health notification was 4 days, current variants incubation is 2 days, to quick for schools to be notified by Island Health
- LP understand the reasons, used Covid case report for the island for making decisions, not doing it anymore, process for testing takes too long and if you are a mild case they are not tested. wonder if students miss too much school, will this be considered for grading?
- TD Speak with the teacher about your student regarding assessments. Covid is in our community, change practices and stay attuned to your own health, not what is in the community
- MG extra curricular groups activities taking place?
- TD games yes, no tournaments and no audience, hoping restrictions will be removed at the end of January SBO postponed external groups coming into schools
- MG high school students have made pledges to reconciliation, students voices need to be heard more, they have great ideas, is it possible for a reconciliation extra curricular activity?
- BC support this idea, to talk to ISW, InEd should not own reconciliation, talk to principal, ownership by the school, teacher, it is happening organized with the Downie Wenjack project, leadership teachers are incredible with projects like this, leadership teachers have avenues to connect with existing groups
- TD best ideas come from students, a group of students can start this on their own, clubs do need a sponsor teacher
- TD one person starts with an idea, sponsor is the facilitator, they help with getting the word out
- LP great idea MG, shy students may not join, like to see senior leadership take initiative and show reconciliation
- BC student interest, shows passion and internal leadership, SBO is on board, schools are working on reconciliation
- TMcPhail policies on how we are welcoming students back from winter break, students are locked outside unwelcoming feeling, 8:40 waiting for the staff, delay in entry 20 min wasted, everyone is coming in at once Students no where to eat at lunch, unbalanced comfort zone
- TD correct, a staggered start time, keeping kid outside to alleviate congestion in the hallways, several doors open, hang outside rather than in the hallways, a bumpy road with start up, secondary schools reducing congestion in hallways during class changes, admin and teachers are constantly changing, doing their best to control contact, encourage to share these concerns with teachers and staff
