## Scholarship for Indigenous<sup>i</sup> Students

### What is the Scholarship for Indigenous Students?

This is an entrance scholarship for people of Indigenous ancestry, including First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples. Two scholarships equivalent to 60 credits, including books, will be awarded each year starting in Winter 2023. Students will be required to submit their scholarship application package before the deadlines stated and need to have successfully gained admission into the college before the Winter 2023 term.

### Eligibility Requirements:

- Indigenous ancestry (First Nation, Inuit, or Métis)
- Canadian citizen, permanent resident, convention refugee, protected person
- Eligible for admission to the college (see [Academic Calendar](#))
- Submitted scholarship application package before stated deadline
- Admitted to the college before term starts

### Scholarship Checklist/Steps:

- ☐ Personal narrative in a written format (500 words)
- ☐ Copy of your Status/Métis card and/or a community letter and/or a letter from your band Métis office<sup>ii</sup>

<sup>i</sup> Alexander College uses the term "Indigenous" in place of "Aboriginal" as held in the spirit of its use in section 35(2) of the Canadian Constitution, to refer inclusively to members of First Nations, status and non-status, treaty and non-treaty Indians, Métis, and Inuit peoples in Canada, recognizing that many people prefer the terms that are specific and traditional to their communities.

## Selection Criteria:

The applications received by the deadline will proceed to the next evaluation step. Applications will then be evaluated based on the following:

- Career goals that are aligned with Alexander College Programs
- Noteworthy academic or athletic achievements and participation in school or community activities
- Contributions to environmental protection, enhancement, or promotion
- Skills as demonstrated in the application package

All communication is directed to each student who will be notified by a formal letter emailed by the end of December. This letter will state whether the applicant will receive an award or not. Recipient award letters will include further required details in order to process the scholarship funds.

## Scholarship Funding Guidelines:

- Scholarships are for Winter 2023 term.
- Scholarship payments are administered directly from Alexander College Student Financial Services to the award recipient to offset tuition, school fees, books and supplies, or any other expenses at the discretion of the college.
- Students are expected to be enrolled in full-time studies for the duration of the Scholarship.
- Due to the administration process, this scholarship may not be released in time for tuition fee deadlines.
