One piece I am so excited about as we move into 2024 is the collaborative aspect of our presentations. As DPAC we strive to be a resource for parents regarding the district, and learning more about the components and subject matter experts will hopefully save our busy parents time and stress. 90% of navigating an unfamiliar system is knowing whom to ask, especially when you may not know how to word the question.

For the next few months I will be continuing to coordinate with new speakers we have not yet heard from and seeking partnerships whenever possible. I am meeting with Out In Schools this month to discuss a presentation regarding supporting LGTBQ2IA+ youth in schools. Emergency Preparedness Committee - Shawn Thir

- No meeting in December.
- The major earthquake in Japan, notes for DPAC that we should consider. Japan has a sophisticated system for alerting during an earthquake, with a few second warning prior to shaking. The system takes over your media and conveys the location and intensity of the quake. Phones and tvs will go off. Suddenly all devices will begin alarming. Can be dramatic in large groups. Japan does not use the Richter System. The alternate system uses 0-7 with 9 levels. Level 7 earthquake in Mishikawa. 28K people evacuation centres. Schools being used as evacuation centres resulting in making it challenging to teach students.
- Organization is done on a community level. Could not help but reflect on our local infrastructure (eg bridges) and how our CV environment would cope in a similar event.

Superintendent Report - Jeremy Morrow

- Honoring the effort that DPAC puts in through candid and collaborative conversations around ways we can improve connection and experience.
- New 3 Year Calendar coming. Next year's 3 Year Calendar will be done in two years to avoid the gap this year. Commitment will be done in two years so we are always a year in advance to avoid the headaches for families trying to plan in advance without a calendar.
- Feeding Futures Report will be presented in draft form to Trustees next week. It will likely be reported on at the Board Meeting.
- There are six months to go with this school year. Background administration year is January-to-January. Kindergarten registration happening in the next couple of weeks. Secretary Treasurer hiring this week. External consultant this Friday for how to move forward with the Strategic Plan consultation sessions.
- Acknowledge that this is a tricky time for everyone, and that the transit strike is impacting families.
- Post-holiday, it was nice to enjoy a break but equally nice to be excited about getting back to work.
- Job postings question: What is the HR Advisor role? Answer: A maternity leave that needs to be filled
- Assc Superintendent Indigenous Education position is a replacement to the deputy superintendent
 position prior. As a district we have established that we need to address the disparity and inequity of
 outcomes for indigenous vs non-indigenous students.
- Question from Chris Parker: The new PRISM system tracks injuries to employees. Will it be used to track incidents and injuries for students? Answer: Internal use for staff and HR. Question: What is PRISM? Answer: it is a new health and safety software that tracks incidents.

Trustees Report - Sarah Jane Howe & Janice Caton

- SJ was excited to come to the meeting tonight and looking forward to DPAC as she hadn't been for 6-8 months. SJ gets to see regular PAC reps but not all of the reps for the district and she is happy to see them. Comment about the Speaker Series: Can we bring back the White Hatter? Answer: Yes.
- Working with a consultant on a framework for community engagement, collecting information and connecting with community in the process of forging the Strategic Plan.
- Trustee Appointments for schools have stayed the same, as well as committees, move to change this to transition to follow the school year calendar vs the traditional board calendar.

- 1) Library Report 2) Technology Report 3) Lake Park Society update.
- Presentation on International school program and the benefits of the program from the students and families participating.
- Craig Sorochan presented the year-in-review district media highlights and slideshow.

- District choir festival hosted. How impactful that festival is for our young musicians. The depth of the
 adjudication process. Students spent 20 minutes with a professional adjudicator and the before and
