4 Presentation - Jina Taylor, District Physical Literacy Support Teacher K-9

Relatively new position in the District, her role is to support teachers in teaching physical literacy. Physical literacy video attached. Technical issues meant the video wouldn't play, but the synopsis of video is a child saying, "If you don't teach us these skills at this age we struggle to learn them." Sport for Life has been hired by the Ministry of Health for physical literacy, partly because of covid and also because of screens. There is a Ministry push on getting kids active at both school and at home. Efficient learning of physical skills from a young age to build an existing framework for the skills to extend in older kids. Physical literacy skills build both physical competence to build social confidence. Fundamental movement skills are a huge push. They include: running, jumping, balancing, rolling, and kicking. Three skills categories: locomotor, non-locomotor, manipulative. Locomotor (eg. run hop skip jump) non-locomotor (eg. bend squat twist balance lift) manipulative

(eg. throw catch toss) *full list not captured. If we don't teach kids from a young age then it's much harder to build them back up later from a deficit. A key mindset is when going to do physical activities, "Are we are doing them with purpose? Why are we playing this game? How do we get the most minutes out of a day being active?" Strategies for building physical activity into their day and keeping them active. Programs teaching kids to learn rules for games so they know how to play with official rules. Teaching kids the official rules for Gaga Ball. Another aspect of Jina's role in facilitating community members of team sports to come to schools to help promote physical literacy, including specialists in sports to help teach the teachers. Jina has developed a monthly family challenge of the fundamental movement skills. These include handouts with video links and fitness calendar. Draws and prizes.

DPAC Rep: Question about rules: can we reach out to get rules for our playground equipment? Yes, Jina will send it to principals. When Jina can get out to a school to work with the staff, it can essentially become an embedded Pro-D which is amazing for both kids and staff in building capacity.

Question: Kendall: Activities for visually-impaired kids? Answer: Jina: Blind ball is coming.

5 Reports

Chair Report - Jennifer Fisher

- Continue to meet monthly with the Superintendent to review historical issues as well and emerging issues. Continued to work on the C&B and reach out to reps. Supported the Speaker Series in planning for this year and emailing all of the requested links (at this point 100+). Working with our executive to support the addition of committees such as Anti-racism.
- Participated in the Calendar Committee
 - Question for parent population - Pro-D days, preference: Full day or Half day, and preference to Monday/Friday vs mid-week?

DPAC Treasurer- Kendall Packham:

- Switch over just happened and a budget will be made with a goal of a continuous flow throughout the year. New meeting will have updated numbers.

Sexual Health Committee - Megan Cowling

- *Trigger warning - reported sexual assault of a minor*
 - Recent news from the Sooke District SD62 re: student walkout over lack of communication, policy and follow-through in addressing the reported sexual assault of a student on school grounds by other students. More coverage of the issue and response can be found in a multi-page report by the Times-Colonist Saturday Dec 16th. In the article, the issue of reporting protocols or lack thereof is discussed in-depth. Sooke District has a full-time sexual health coordinator they hired in September. The Chek News story features three grandmothers who mention that the time has long past for sexual violence to be something kids have to navigate at school.

- Our SHC members continue the onboarding process re: BCCPAC provincial level SH (sexual health) committee, signing the privacy agreements and confidentiality agreements. We happily noted the presence of the GBVC (Gender-based Violence Committee) in the most recent board meeting agenda. We are excited our district is taking the next steps to address gender-based violence for all students and hope that we can be among the first in the province to create policies that reflect our commitment to safety while learning.

Speaker Series Committee - Megan Cowling

- Excited to welcome back the White Hatter but the excitement is tempered by the many stories we are hearing re: sextortion and grooming happening within our community. At this point more than 100 requests for the links, including from across the province (which we have had to decline in this instance.) Please note the first presentation is typically booked for school audiences and it is designed to be watched by youth. The two other presentations are designed for parents/caregivers and the content of the last presentation may be 18+ (although the White Hatter is very good at giving warnings re: content.) Excellent that the name recognition of the White Hatter helps with uptake, but also note that free presentations through Safer Schools are also available throughout the year.

- Connecting with the CDTA re: upcoming February Pro-D Day topic.
- Attended an amazing presentation at Arden on the visual therapy and examining the link between vision and learning challenges with special thanks to JJ Goff for hosting and facilitating.
- FoodSafe - Good turnout for the first one but second was more challenging. Happy to help PACs with a package to get their Food Safe for their members at a reduced and affordable rate. Contact DPAC for notes on how to run this program.
- Benoit Valliant is working with SD Print Shop to create and hand out posters for families re: helmets. Sneak peek was amazing, this will be a great resource for families.

School Food Subcommittee - Shawn Thir

- Universal school food program at the Federal level. A petition sent to our federal gov't. Federal gov't passed Bill C32 framework for a federal national school food program. Currently on track to go to the senate, the framework, then window of time for deliberation. Federal election is approaching.

Emergency Preparedness Committee - Shawn Thir

- Did not meet in January because Shawn was away. Planning to meet. Always welcoming new members.

Superintendent Report - Dr. Jeremy Morrow

- Noting the number of parent representatives in the room and would like to acknowledge that it's wonderful & humbling to work with such an engaged community.
- Further changes and reorganizing at the district office. The director of operations will be retiring, change in director of human resources, currently an acting Secretary-Treasurer and the new Secretary-Treasurer begins in March. Significant change and opportunity to transform our culture into a thriving place of learning. The new Secretary Treasurer (ST) has experience in two other districts. ST will be overseeing HR, which then opened the new Director of Finance position at the district. The word "stability" is a cherished one as we recruit and retain. Creating an Assistant ST position will help. Dr. Morrow remembers the days in which a grade 6/7 teaching position would have 126 applicants back in the day.
- MOE (Ministry of Education & Childcare) announced a new cell phone policy on Friday afternoon. The district staff will have received some Ministry information but not yet sure what this will mean. When looking at policy examples, the potential of a "Green Yellow Red" (cell usage permissions defined by area correlated to stop light colours) policy is an exploratory potential. We as a district will be involving parents in the communication of any new policy.
- Communication policies are a topic of interest for parents. Systemic communication issues can be a line item of improvement. We would like to leverage your parent engagement to make this better.
- The Associate of Indigenous Ed position has closed. We are looking at the way we can change the hiring process to decolonize that hiring process and be different from the beginning. Very high quality applicants and we are excited to staff that critical position. Crucial to note that when we move forward on behalf of Indigenous students and families, we move forward on behalf of all students.

- The topic of the Food Scan and noting Courtenay El's high quality and nutritious food servings. Noting Cumberland's amazing program. Unique opportunity to advance and with the new funding we can look at enhancing the great work that's already there. Staff were commissioned to present a report and Trustees recognized that wisdom in community and bringing in the table talk to facilitate conversations. Potentially a board motion at the end of February on this topic.
 - Question: Joanne Barr: when looking at the committee of the whole are the community schools considered a stakeholder at the table? We feel it is very important to have Community Schools as a seat at the table as a reference. Answer: Dr. Morrow: That is a good point to consider.

Trustees Report

Susan Leslie

- Really wonderful to see all of you tonight. Learning a lot by being present and the tone is lovely.
- January update is that Trustees met with Lisa Bernoties McCullough regarding the Strat Plan (Strategic Plan). Trustees were there Friday and Saturday. In terms of focusing our attention in the Strat Plan process and what the FESL (Framework for Enhanced Student Learning) is really about. How Strat Plans connect with this framework to meet criteria within the FESL and focus on being about all learning. When these plans intersect, access and opportunity and equity combine to make amazing learning opportunities. When we looked at the FESL, the board focused in on the classroom as a venue for learning and identifying the vulnerable gaps. Our role is to make sure that our district is following the steps and procedures meeting the criteria to what that looks like. We have looked at core competencies and what those look like. Not just numeracy and literacy but also strategies for critical thinking which is important with our children's access to social media. This planning was a deeply informative session that will help put forward the best strategies for improving student learning. Many plans and processes will begin rolling out so stay-tuned.
- Important items: Kindergarten registration presentation at the January Board meeting. Lisa Pedersen-Skene provided an overview. Our district offers five kindergarten programs. Registration was a month earlier this year. Numbers are growing each week.
- Feeding Futures Food Scan: presented at the meeting. Two CoW (Committee of Whole) meetings will come after, one closed and one open where rights and stakeholders will meet for generative dialogue. Also would like to acknowledge our hard work as parents and caregivers around food. Food is love, warming your heart and your tummy. A lot more discussion to share on steps moving forward.
- Tribune Bay Outdoor Ed center suspended operations. Jointly managed with other school districts. Unfortunately the TBOEC is experiencing financial struggles. Renewal of the permit is upcoming in Dec. 2024. Schools that have already booked and have deposited will be returned. That return of deposit should happen within 4-6 weeks.
- Shannon: follow ups: It is a big contribution for all of us to come to two meetings (PAC and DPAC) as even a couple of hours a month is a lot in family life. Echo some of Jeremy's enthusiasm around changes in culture and engaging in generative dialogue at every level of the system. New report will help us think about larger goals in mind with greater efficiency. One piece additionally: establishing a GBV (Gender-Based Violence) Committee board meeting in June 2020. Small subcommittee working on ToR (Terms of Reference) will be asked to engage.

5 New Business

- Anti-Racism Committee: Dan & Carly
 - Brooklyn Parents here to explore the possibility of an Anti-Racism Subcommittee. Appreciative that our Principal brought in MAR Canada for primary and intermediate assemblies, and workshops for staff. We also have a Black history month display that can be shared out.

- Dan & Carly moved 2.5 years ago from the mainland, and their son has been directly affected by racism at school and in the community, and are finding that no one knows how to have these conversations when situations arise in schools.
- Anti-Racism curriculum is being created/or has been, parents with first hand experience can offer insight, can be challenging to watch overt racism happening in our schools with divisiveness winning, or worse ambivalence or denial. Racism is happening, how can we help create opportunities to bridge the gap, how to have a helpful dialogue, These kids are going to go to other communities, we need them to be loving and accepting of diversity.
 - Jeremy- thank you for sharing, this is a vulnerable place to be. Some files we are ahead of in this District, but for Anti-racism we are behind in. There is a difference between not being racist and being anti-racist. All of our students of color, as well as LGBTQIA2S+ are experiencing this. Karma from Glacier view is working on a framework to be presented to Trustees this Spring to be implemented this Fall. This is a major area we need to address.

- At Arden Elementary Benoit came through to present on the Bike Safety, was captivating with helmet and connection with the kids. He was great at age-appropriate questions. Arden had the Green Team subcommittee and Benoit reached out to the Green Team.
