# **Reports:**

# i. Principal's Report:

- Grad dessert night Feb 29th.
- Basketball Tournaments are coming up.
- All sports clubs are doing great.
- Provincial Assessments started today for Numeracy.
- Starting course programming for 2024/2025 February to spring break initial enrollment projections close to 1000 (includes international students) for next year.
- Cultural exchanges: Italians were here in September, Isfeld students heading to Italy over spring break. Upcoming exchange for next year in Thailand.
- Mental health and wellness committee did various activities throughout December and it was really positive. Students are starting to engage more.
- Transit Strike/Job Action: 5 or 6 parents have reached out in concern. Our current stance is that this is a program of choice High School and the school bus system isn't able to accommodate due to catchment restrictions. There is a meeting slated for tomorrow for further discussion.

Q: What's our attendance rate regarding this? Are we losing kids/increased absences? A: Not significant at this time. There is a lot of carpooling happening and families are finding alternatives. Q: Why does a district employee have to travel with the sports teams? A: It's a legal district requirement.

Q: What is the procedure if teachers bring in outside presenters for classes? Are those people required to sign the volunteer standards that we do?

A: No, because they're not supervising children. But any concerns that come up can be brought to me for follow up
