 - a. Principal's Report
 - i. Feeding the Futures - salad bar this wednesday and one after spring break as make up, need to move Ivan to Feeding Futures at lunch and breakfast, after talking with Hanna there is not enough volunteers to continue with salad bar, may be able to have a paired down salad bar or soups/wraps, met with Thea and have \$15,000 for Feeding Futures
 - ii. Course programming - only a select number that not filled in
 - iii. Dessert Night was as success
 - iv. Grad Timeline - finalized will be sent to students parents
 - v. Project enrollment - staffing for 952 students, grade 7 at french school is high, but Robb Road is smaller than normal, could be good to have more francophone students culturally, balances out this year, but there is a bubble in grade 1 which will cause a space issue in the future, Valley View is tricky since current grade 1 enrollment is low, low family turn over in Crown Royal homes, projected to 1070-1080 students in next 4 to 5 years
 - vi. Anti Racism - training ongoing, Carmi Tashi doing presentation to Isfeld staff, group from Burnaby coming in late May presentation to students
 - vii. Flex parent survey - will go out this week
 - viii. District student voice - Heather Beckett humanities teacher, model UN, will get answers from students on specific Isfeld issues, and will share

with parents/students, UN students going to Thailand on second half of cultural change
