CAREER CENTRE/ WORK EXPERIENCE/VOLUNTEERING

Volunteer at The Views - it is that time of the year where Providence Living at The Views is preparing their Summer 2025 Youth Volunteer program! The Chief Joe Mathias Aboriginal Scholarship is one of the longest running and largest Indigenous scholarships in BC. With the generous support of private donors and the Province of BC, we have provided over 500 scholarships to students from almost every First Nation in BC. Full eligibility requirements are provided in the application forms and can be downloaded from our website at Chief Joe Mathias British Columbia Aboriginal Scholarship Fund. If a student does not meet the eligibility requirements for one of the specialty scholarships, we encourage you to apply under the original, non-specialty scholarship application form. GRADS

Grad tickets are available at the office! BEFORE you can pick up your tickets, you need to:

- have all school fees paid (check MyEd)
- have your 30 work/volunteer hours in (see Work Experience office)
- all course credits met (see VP if unsure)
- Go the Library first to get your Library clearance slip: outstanding books returned or paid for
- Bursary thank you cards done

A reminder to log in and make your Post Secondary Institution selections in the <u>StudentTranscripts Service</u> (STS). You will need to do this for post secondary institutions to be able to access your Transcripts. <u>Most public BC and Alberta universities and colleges and the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC)</u> can retrieve ongoing transcript updates as soon as authorized by the student in STS.
