

It's a chance to see some of the pieces representing the region's First Nations history. The exhibition exploring the difficult colonial history of the region reflects the voices of the peoples who experienced it. It was co-curated with Chief Robert Joseph of the Gwawaenuk First Nation and Ḥaa'yuups of the Hupačasath First Nation.

For those of you who are new to the school, the Miracle Beach PAC does a weekly hot lunch program every Friday. All orders and accounts are done online. There is an ordering timeframe (see below) as to when online orders may be placed for the current menu. The current menu, Fall 1 - 2023 Hot Lunch, includes hot lunch every Friday from October 6th until November 17th. *Ordering for this menu set will start today, and is open until Wed., October 4th. Late orders will not be accepted so please place your order before this date.* 

A couple of things to note regarding payment methods for this school year:

- Payment methods that will be accepted this year are: PayPal or E-transfer. No cash or cheques please!
- PayPal -- pay through your PayPal account, or login as a guest.

  - Please make sure to note your child's name in the comments section, and what the payment is for (ie. hot lunch).

The following hot lunches will be available this year: hot dogs, pizza, Pita Pit, sushi, lo mein and Butchers Block (spanakopita, samosas and sausage rolls) with most days having vegetarian options. Extra options include milk, juice and cookies.

#### **School Bus**

Rules for Riding the Bus

- Be at the bus stop 5 minutes ahead of the posted schedule. The bus will not wait for those who
  are late
- Stay on the shoulder or sidewalk, well away from the pavement, while waiting for the bus
- Do not run beside the bus while it is moving
- Boarding the bus will be in single file
- No saving spots in line or seats on the bus
- Take your seat right away
- The bus driver is always in charge
- Remain seated while the bus is in motion
- No eating on the school bus
- No fighting, bullying or horseplay on the bus
- Do not throw litter out the window of the bus
- Always keep head and arms in the bus

#### **Volunteering with the School**

All parent volunteers will be asked to complete a Criminal Record Check before they are able to drive, volunteer in the classroom or participate in field trips. If you are thinking about volunteering at the school, please take the time to complete the Criminal Record Check process early in the school year. Criminal Record Checks are valid for 3 years once complete and will remain on file at the school.

Connect is designed for all families. It addresses changes that occur between teens and their parents or caregivers. It also helps them keep their relationship strong and positive. This can then help to protect the teens as they move forward in their journey to adulthood.

# Why Connect?

Connect was developed for parents and caregivers of pre-teens and teens. It was designed based on strong scientific evidence in the areas of:

- ☑ Child and adolescent development
- ☑ Trauma, social, emotional and mental health
- ☑ Parenting and family functioning
- ☑ Prevention and intervention
- @ Parents' feedback

# Does Connect Work?

Connect is an evidence-based and traumainformed intervention. Parents and caregivers
report that the program is extremely helpful for
both themselves and their children. For example,
they say that they feel less stressed as parents.
They feel that they are more effective and
competent in their parenting. They report
improvements in their relationships with their
children. They see fewer behavioural and mental
health problems in their children. They also see
their children function better in social situations.

We always listen to parents and caregivers. Every time a Connect group is provided, we make sure to get feedback from all the parents and caregivers in the group. We then use these feedback to shape Connect Attachment Programs. We also continue to evaluate Connect as it grows and evolves.
