Self-Identification of Indigenous Ancestry (First Nations, Métis, or Inuit)

Indigenous Education Services in School District #71 (Comox Valley) offers various supports and opportunities to over 1,750 students of Indigenous Ancestry. Our goal is to enrich the educational opportunities for all our Indigenous students. The focus for our service is to enhance all Indigenous students' understanding of their heritage, their sense of belonging and the personal belief that they can be successful in the British Columbia public school system.

Indigenous Ancestry is determined on a *voluntary basis through verbal self-identification*. This includes First Nations (Status or Non-Status), Métis or Inuit Ancestry. We <u>do not require further documentation</u>. Ancestry may go back several generations and a Status Card is not required.

Updated School Code of Conduct

Over the past school year, we updated the <u>Miracle Beach Code of Conduct</u>. I have included it as an attachment on this email, and it is also available on our website.

Outside at Recess and Lunch

Students will be outside at recess and lunch unless the weather is really bad outside. Please ensure students have weather appropriate clothing with them at school. Also, Miracle Beach is in a beautiful rural area of the Comox Valley. As a result, we have the occasional visitor from nature. All classes will review best practice for bear and cougar safety. We encourage students to not take food outside during recess and lunch. By not allowing garbage to be on the playground and field it will help reduce visits from bears and cougars.

Emergency Response & Fire Drills

Regular fire drills and emergency response drills will be held throughout the year to practise student safety procedures. Our first full school Fire Drill is scheduled for September 13th. Classroom teachers will walk through expectations and practice with students during the first week of school.

School Supplies

For the 2023-24 school year Miracle Beach will be providing basic school supplies to students in kindergarten to grade 7. Instead of parents purchasing individual sets of supplies, families provide money to the school and the school will purchase supplies for each student. This approach will ensure equity and equality among all students and will save parents time (no shopping!) and money (ordering in bulk, our discount on school supplies is significant). The only items parents will have to provide are a backpack, a lunch bag, and appropriate shoes for gym.

Kindergarten to grade 7 the fee will be \$40

The office will accept cash, cheque, or e-transfer
Fees are due no later than September 22nd - Thank you to those families who have already paid.

School Bus

In continued partnership with our transportation provider, First Student, Comox Valley Schools, SD71, is offering First View/Parent View, a bus tracking and parent communications app for your smartphone or desktop.

- To create an account, you will need your student's pupil ID, along with a special code:
- The code will be provided from the district once your student is a confirmed registered regular rider with the bus company.
- The district will be sending out codes once received from the bus company.

Rules for Riding the Bus

- Be at the bus stop 5 minutes ahead of the posted schedule. The bus will not wait for those who
 are late
- Stay on the shoulder or sidewalk, well away from the pavement, while waiting for the bus
- Do not run beside the bus while it is moving
- Boarding the bus will be in single file
- No saving spots in line or seats on the bus
- Take your seat right away
- The bus driver is always in charge
- Remain seated while the bus is in motion
- No eating on the school bus
- No fighting, bullying or horseplay on the bus
- Do not throw litter out the window of the bus
- Always keep head and arms in the bus

Volunteering with the School

All parent volunteers will be asked to complete a Criminal Record Check before they are able to drive, volunteer in the classroom or participate in field trips. If you are thinking about volunteering at the school, please take the time to complete the Criminal Record Check process early in the school year. Criminal Record Checks are valid for 3 years once complete and will remain on file at the school.
