#### **Family Learning Sessions**

Three virtual <u>erase</u> learning sessions for families will be held on November 8, 28, and 30, focusing on establishing safe, caring, and respectful digital communities. These online sessions are best suited for families and youth aged 10 and above.

Family Session: Establishing Safe, Caring, & Respectful Digital Communities - Everyone Welcome!

**Details:** Recommended for Parents/Caregivers/Grandparents and youth aged 10 and up as a way to facilitate the conversation of safe and caring use of technology at home and in the community. This session covers all things digital, from how to be a good digital citizen, the criminal consequences of cyberbullying, and how to report and receive support in cases of sexting/sextortion. Some of the most prominent concerns currently surrounding use of social media platforms, smartphones, and artificial intelligence will be discussed.

#### **School Bus**

Rules for Riding the Bus

- Be at the bus stop 5 minutes ahead of the posted schedule. The bus will not wait for those who are late
- Stay on the shoulder or sidewalk, well away from the pavement, while waiting for the bus
- Do not run beside the bus while it is moving
- Boarding the bus will be in single file
- No saving spots in line or seats on the bus
- Take your seat right away
- The bus driver is always in charge
- Remain seated while the bus is in motion
- No eating on the school bus
- No fighting, bullying or horseplay on the bus
- Do not throw litter out the window of the bus
- Always keep head and arms in the bus





Connect is designed for all families. It addresses changes that occur between teens and their parents or caregivers. It also helps them keep their relationship strong and positive. This can then help to protect the teens as they move forward in their journey to adulthood.

## Why Connect?

Connect was developed for parents and caregivers of pre-teens and teens. It was designed based on strong scientific evidence in the areas of:

- Trauma, social, emotional and mental
- Parenting and family functioning
- ☑ Prevention and intervention
- ☑ Parents' feedback
- Short- and long-term treatment effectiveness

## Does Connect Work?

Connect is an evidence-based and traumainformed intervention. Parents and caregivers report that the program is extremely helpful for both themselves and their children. For example, they say that they feel less stressed as parents. They feel that they are more effective and competent in their parenting. They report improvements in their relationships with their children. They see fewer behavioural and mental health problems in their children. They also see their children function better in social situations.

We always listen to parents and caregivers. Every time a Connect group is provided, we make sure to get feedback from all the parents and caregivers in the group. We then use these feedback to shape Connect Attachment Programs. We also continue to evaluate Connect as it grows and evolves. For more information about Connect and the latest research, please


