
Rules for Riding the Bus

- Be at the bus stop 5 minutes ahead of the posted schedule. The bus will not wait for those who are late
- Stay on the shoulder or sidewalk, well away from the pavement, while waiting for the bus
- Do not run beside the bus while it is moving
- Boarding the bus will be in single file
- No saving spots in line or seats on the bus
- Take your seat right away
- The bus driver is always in charge
- Remain seated while the bus is in motion
- No eating on the school bus
- No fighting, bullying or horseplay on the bus
- Do not throw litter out the window of the bus
- Always keep head and arms in the bus


If we could please ask families to:

- **Reinforce Rules at Home:** Please take a moment to review the bus rules with your child and emphasize the importance of following them for their safety and the safety of others.
- **Encourage Communication:** Encourage your child to communicate any concerns or incidents that occur on the bus directly to the driver. This helps us address issues quickly and effectively.
- Model Respectful Behavior: Older students play a crucial role as mentors and leaders on the
 bus. Encourage them to model respectful behavior, following the rules diligently. Their example
 sets the tone for younger passengers and reinforces the importance of bus safety throughout
 the school community.
