### **School Supplies for 2024/2025**

For the 2024-2025 school year Miracle Beach School will be providing basic school supplies to students in kindergarten to Grade 7. Instead of parents purchasing individual sets of supplies, we ask parents to provide money to the school in June-September and the school will purchase supplies for each student. This approach will ensure equity and equality among all students and will save parents time (no shopping!) and money. As we order in bulk, our discount on school supplies is significant. Students will have the materials when needed as everything will be in the classroom. The only items parents will have to provide are a backpack, a lunch bag, a water bottle, and appropriate shoes for gym.

Please note that the overall cost for school supplies this year has increased. However, the increased cost of supplies has been offset by the Families Affordability Funds, a one-time funding provided by the Ministry of Education to help offset costs due to global inflation. The cost for school supplies this year will remain the same as it has been in previous years.

Any family experiencing financial hardship may request a fee waiver by contacting the school.

Kindergarten to Grade 7 the fee will be **\$40**

- The office will accept cash, cheque, or email transfer
- Fee's will be due September 30<sup>th</sup>
