English 11/12: Short Story Unit Guidelines

For each short story that you read, you'll do a brief analysis. Use the following guidelines to help structure your response.

<u>Setting:</u> In 1 paragraph describe when the story takes place, where it takes place, what's going on in the world in your story at this time, & any other relevant details about the setting.

<u>Character Analysis:</u> Write at least 1 paragraph for each of the major characters in the story. Make sure to include: personality type, role in the story, appearance, age, and anything else you think is important about the character. Do they remind you of someone you know? A character from a movie or another book you've read?

<u>Plot Summary:</u> In 2-3 paragraphs summarize the major events of the story. In other words, pretend you're explaining the story to someone who hasn't read it but not spending an hour doing so.

<u>Themes / Message:</u> In 2-3 paragraphs identify and discuss the major themes & messages of the story. What do you think the author is trying to say with this story?

<u>Conflict</u>: Conflict is central to most stories. The conflict in a given story typically falls within one of the following categories: Person vs Environment (eg. a character is at odds with society at large), Person vs Self (the conflict is within the character, aka an internal conflict), Person vs Person (the conflict is between the character/s and another character of group of people). In 1 paragraph, describe at least one of the conflicts in your story.

<u>Reaction:</u> However long you want it to be – this is your chance to be honest about what you thought of the story. Tell me what you liked about the story, what you didn't like about it; questions that it makes you ask; did it relate to you on a personal level? Things you agreed with or disagreed with. Really, any reactions you have to the story that you want to share.
