3. Presentation with Q&A

Char Siddon

- Char Siddon CORE & parent workshops
- Her story was teaching in kelowna and seeing more and more challenges with getting to school and experienced a suicide with a boy she knew. More and more kids who "didn't want to be here"
- This has sparked a passion to build community amongst parents/children at the school so parents and teachers can all be on the same page.
- WHY are more children/adolecents experiencing dysregulated emotions, negative behaviours, anxiety, depression, suicide
- WHAT can parents and teachers do?
 - Understanding emotions zones of regulation
 - Resolving conflicts (tough talks)
 - Calm Corner Strategy
 - Rest & Reset Room Strategy
- BC Curriculum: letter grades have been phased out to help students own their own learning and think about their own thinking. Many kids were graduating without the "core" competencies.
 - Communication
 - Thinking
 - Personal & Social
- Kids can google anything but they also need to understand how to be a good listener, etc..
- This is a strategic goal within the school and SD71.
- The Zones of Self Regulation understanding emotions: Used in the classroom to give more vocabulary to describe how they feel
- Conflict Resolution TOUGH TALKS Grade 6's are being empowered to be tough talk leaders

Bri & Char did a mock tough talk
"I like you because"
"I feel sad & disappointed"
"My wish is that"

"I heard you say....." - repeat the statements about the issue followed by an opportunity to apologize and ask for forgiveness

- A parent workshop on this topic was suggested.
- Looking at a workshop in the future
- Suggested to also have a video/zoom for parents to watch Char would prefer it to be in person. Success typically comes from the intimate sessions
- Will need to poll interest/topics

- Char shared a list of resources provided in the slideshow
- New Royston Report which will now be done 1/month that is in alignment with the new character development intentions with Grade 6s
