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Update from our Public Health Nurse:

Pertussis cases are currently rising within Island Health.

- Localized clusters in Island Health recently have contributed to an overall increase in pertussis rates
- Infants under the age of 1 currently have the highest incidence of pertussis, followed by preschool children 1-4 years
- Families and caregivers, as well as other close contacts of the infant, are encouraged to be vaccinated with Tdap

Pertussis, or whooping cough, is a very contagious disease of the respiratory tract. It is caused by a bacterium found in the mouth, nose and throat of a person who is infected. Infants are the population for whom pertussis can have the most severe outcomes, and direct protection can be obtained through routine childhood immunizations provided through public health.

All adults should receive one dose of Tdap vaccine if they have not previously received a pertussis containing vaccine in adulthood. This is recommended by NACI, but not provided free in BC, and can be obtained through a local pharmacy.

Tdap is also recommended and provided free to all pregnant people in every pregnancy. Vaccination in pregnancy is typically through Public Health, where we connect and discuss prenatal care.



There is also the ENTER 2 program offered at Highland Secondary School for incoming grade 8 students.

Students enrolled in ENTER2 attend in-person classes three days a week at Highland Secondary School and engage in online learning from home for the remaining two days. This blended learning model allows students to progress at their own pace and undertake projects that align with their individual interests. The curriculum is fully



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accredited by the BC Ministry of Education and is structured around STEM-focused learning cycles, covering topics such as computer systems, robotics, and digital game design.
