

Dear Valley View Families,

Another exciting school year is just around the corner at Valley View Elementary. We hope summer has been restful and rejuvenating for everyone. Our team of teachers and staff is busily preparing for the year and we are excited to see students and families return next week.

Here are a few key items and friendly reminders:

1. First morning of school - Tuesday, September 8th from 8:35 - 11:45 am (Warning Bell goes at 8:30am). Students will go to their new classrooms for this half day. (new Kindergarten students do not attend)

2. Class placement – 2026-2027 student/class placement will be communicated to families via email late afternoon/early evening on Monday, September 7th. Please note that office staff and teachers will not be able to give out class placement information before it is emailed on the 7th. Be sure to check your email Monday evening / Tuesday morning for up-to-date information on class placement and where to meet your child's new teacher.

3. Second day of school and beyond - Wednesday, September 9th from 8:35 - 2:30 (regular schedule for everyone - except kindergarten).

4. New students/families (gr. 1-7) – New Grade 1-7 students and families are invited to a visit an orientation session on Friday, September 4th, at 11:00 am. Meet at the school's front doors.

5. New Kindergarten Students – We will be welcoming 33 new kindergarten students this year in 3 different classes. The kindergarten gradual entry process and schedules were emailed to K families in July. Please let us know if you need more information or didn't receive the July email.

6. School Supplies (K-7) - School supplies will be purchased and centralized through each classroom and will cost **\$50** per student. You can pay via cash or cheque, but e-transfer is preferred at valleyview@sd71.bc.ca. Please be sure to write School Supplies 26-27 and your child's name in the notes of the e-transfer. As always, parents are still expected to provide a backpack, lunch kit and water bottle. Valley View water bottles are available for purchase at the office for \$2 each. Families requiring financial assistance to pay for school supplies may contact any staff member.

10. Parent Volunteers and Drivers- Thank you for volunteering at the school. Many of our programs and student experiences wouldn't happen without the support of parent and community volunteers:

a) **Criminal Record Check:** all volunteers (classroom, coaching, drivers for field trips, etc...) must complete a criminal record check before starting. If you have done this during the previous 3 school years, your criminal record check is likely still valid. Office staff will contact any expired or expiring CR checks.

b) **Drivers Abstracts and Insurance Documents:** Please note that all driver abstracts, insurance and driver's licence documents are shredded at the end of every school year and must be renewed every school year.

Self-Regulation

To strengthen students' Personal Awareness and Responsibility through intentional development of self-regulation, emotional awareness, resilience, and problem-solving skills so that students are better able to manage challenges, build positive relationships, and engage successfully in learning and the school community.

Building Relationships

To strengthen students' Social Responsibility: Building Relationships skills by developing their ability to communicate respectfully, demonstrate empathy, resolve challenges peacefully, and contribute positively to an inclusive school community where all students feel a sense of belonging and connection.

Why It Matters

Students need strong self-regulation and positive relationship skills because these competencies are foundational to learning and success, helping them feel safe, connected, and confident while engaging in academic learning, navigating challenges, building relationships, and developing the skills needed to thrive in school and beyond.
