Fee Paying International Students:

- Students from 21 countries come and study in our School District.
- 190-200 FTE in the 2017-18 school year
- Approximately 300-350 students in our schools annually

One for One Exchange Students:

- 10-15 students from School District #71 participate annually
- Italy, Spain, Japan, Mexico, Germany, France, Denmark

Cultural Exchange Program:

- Two week true exchange led by school based teacher leaders to China, Germany & Italy
- Rotating through each secondary school annually
