Enhance place based, experiential learning experiences



Expand K'ómoks language programming as resources become available



Use personalized learning approaches tailored to an individual's literacy and numeracy skills



Develop and encourage educational resources that promote an appreciation for the history, language and culture of First Nations people with required curriculum on the residential school experience



Develop and promote enrollment in Indigenous language courses made in consultation with K'ómoks First Nation



Ensure schools support and encourage K'ómoks students to participate and succeed in math, sciences and extracurricular activities



K'ómoks culture will be represented aesthetically in schools



K'ómoks language will be included in signage and communications of schools and the Board



Schools will embed K'ómoks protocols into daily practices



Schools will recognize that they work and learn on the unceded territory of the K'ómoks Nation and as such will promote K'ómoks languages, culture and history in school activities and events
