- Works collaboratively with SD71 to make sure the plurality of K'ómoks culture is accurately represented in the district
- With parental consent, can work with SD71 staff to ensure K'ómoks students succeed and have access to individualized supports if needed
- Supports student transportation

- Maintains and implements the Local Education Agreement
- Holds space for family and student concerns
- Organizes tutoring opportunities in community
- Uses their position to uplift and empower family and student voices
- Works to reduce barriers to success

### **REACH OUT IF YOU ARE A PARENT WHO:**

- Has questions/concerns about your child's education
- Would like support planning for postsecondary or access to additional supports
- Isn't sure who to to talk to about ensuring your child's success
- Needs an advocate
- Needs transportation support
- Would like to give consent for the Education Coordinator to advocate for your child
