CUPE Childcare Presentation

Representatives from CUPE 439 presented a proposal to expand public childcare services by establishing additional facilities within the district. Their request focused on supporting before- and after-school care.

French Programming Update

An update on the district's French programs was provided, highlighting student enrolment, cultural initiatives, and supports for non-French-speaking learners. Strategic Plan Implementation

Superintendent Dr. Jeremy Morrow shared progress on the district's strategic priorities, including the development of school growth plans and departmental planning for the upcoming school year.

Local Education Agreement Update

Associate Superintendent Joe Heslip presented on the Local Education Agreement with K'ómoks First Nation. The presentation focused on communication protocols, student supports, and data-sharing improvements to strengthen collaboration.

BOARD MEETING IN REVIEW CONTINUES

Amended Budget 2024-2025 and Capital Planning Update

The Board reviewed financial updates, including a projected year-end surplus and an increase to the district's operating grant from the Ministry of Education. Trustees received the Q3 financial report and approved the 2025-26 Capital Plan and Capital Bylaw. The Annual Facilities Grant update includes a focus on improving playground accessibility and exploring solar energy installations.

GP Vanier Playfields - Cricket Pitch Concerns

The Superintendent provided a follow-up on recent changes to the layout of the rugby and cricket fields at G.P. Vanier Secondary to improve student safety. A long-term solution is being explored to address field size and buffer concerns.

Le Concours D'art Oratoire winners off to Provincials at SFU

Congratulations to the many students who excelled at Le Concours d'art oratoire, the prestigious French public speaking competition organized nationwide by Canadian Parents for French. The district-level competition saw winners chosen from among hundreds of participants from École Puntledge Park Elementary, École Robb Road Elementary, and Mark R. Isfeld Secondary.

Le Concours d'art oratoire challenges students to write and memorize speeches on topics of their choice, presenting them before judges who evaluate their expression, memorization, quality of French, depth of knowledge, and their responses to impromptu questions.

This year's competition was particularly special as it marked the first year of collaboration with the revitalized Comox Valley Chapter of Canadian Parents for French, which had previously been inactive for nearly a decade. This year's district winners earned the right to represent our district at the provincial competition on May 3 at Simon Fraser University's Surrey Campus.
